(Residence) - The Stipulation of Judgment has been reviewed and submitted back to the Plaintiff's attorney for sign-off and submittal to the Superior Court. I should have final numbers on this matter prior to next month's Status Report. 171 Main St. & 96 Prospect Hill Rd. (Nursing Homes) - Our Town Attorney and I have reviewed the 2 Reply Briefs which were filed by the nursing home owners - we now wait for the scheduling of the oral arguments at the Appellate Court level. Grand List of October 1, 2014 -I have attached the following: Grand List filing A Breakdown of Commercial vs. Residential Gross Assessments Top Ten Taxpayer List There is a drop in the total taxable property (-496,744) which equals -.0522% and represents a total loss of \$14,793.04 (using the 2014/2015 mill rate). As difficult as this loss is, it can be explained and I would like to offer the following: As to Real Estate - Since the filing of the 10/1/2013 Grand list, we have been successful in settling the Appeals relating to Sofia's Plazas - the settlement represented a drop in assessment value of 677,830. An additional 101,061 was dropped due to the demolition of 5 residences (4 mobile homes & a single family home) due to fire damage and the Town acquired one parcel of land on the corner of South Water St. and South Main St. That being said, we still finished on the positive side with an additional gross of 659,900 from the 2013 Grand List base. In December, 2014 the Permitting system was put on-line (following an over 2 year absence) and now may be accessed by our department to enable us to better track real estate permits and valuable property upgrades and will place us in a better scenario for 10/1/2015. As to Personal Property - The business known as STR (Specialized Technology Resources, Inc.) has moved out of town and represents a loss of 12,942,397 in the gross assessment numbers. Following the pertinent reduction due to their manufacturing equipment exemptions, the net assessment loss is 132,410. We have also had a significant loss in applied penalties (281,843) as a result of the outstanding efforts of our Tax Collector in pursuing the uncollected dollars. Declarations were filed more promptly and/or when we were dealing with a closed business, then the files were closed following submittal as to the disposal of property was provided and/or proper proof of closure was provided. Homeowner's benefit letters have gone out to 70 homeowner accounts and 14 other additional veteran applicants who are required by statute to receive notification that they must apply to continue their tax credit Thank you.
