#### **A.** Presentations:

#### 410900 - Registrar of Voters

After reviewing the Registrar of Voter's budget and a brief discussion the Board decided not to make any changes, at this time, to the submitted budget.

MOTION made by (Pippin) and SECONDED by (Nelson) to accept the Registrar of Voter's budget as submitted, with no changes, at this time.

#### 910100 - Broad Brook Library

After reviewing the budget submitted by the Broad Brook Library and a brief discussion about checking on the Non-Profit status of the library the Board decided to revisit the 910100 - Broad Brook Library budget at the March 2, 2017 meeting. To see the breakdown of the Broad Brook Library budget it is hereto attached as Attachment A (1 page).

#### 910100 - Youth Center

After reviewing the budget submitted by the Youth Center and a lengthy discussion about maybe combining with Senior Services and Parks and Recreation the Board decided to revisit the 910100 – Youth Center budget at the March 2, 2017 meeting. The Youth Center wanted it noted they were only asking for Building Expenses not Operating Expenses. To see the budget and presentation submitted by the Youth Center it is hereto attached as Attachment B (6 pages).

#### 910100 - American Heritage River Commission

After reviewing the budget submitted by the American Heritage River Commission and a brief discussion about the \$1,000 increase (for more testing supplies) the Board decided not to make any changes to the submitted budget, at this time.

MOTION made by (Bowsza) and SECONDED by (Pippin) to accept the American Heritage River Commission's budget as submitted, with no changes, at this time.

#### 410100 - First Selectman

After reviewing the budget submitted by the First Selectman and a brief discussion about the salaries the Board decided to revisit the 410100 – First Selectman budget at the March 2, 2017 meeting.

#### **910100 – Activities**

After reviewing the budget submitted for Activities and a lengthy discussion it was decided that they were going to leave the Cemetery Association line at \$17,500 until the make their presentation on March 2, 2017. The Board also decided to change the Recognition line to \$500 from \$1,000. The Board also decided to remove the \$20,000 line for the WHPFD Subsidy.

MOTION made by (Nelson) and SECONDED by (Pippin) to leave the Cemetery Association line at \$17,500 until their presentation and hear the reason for the increase.

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MOTION made by (Bowsza) and SECONDED by (Pippin) to change the Recognition line to \$500 from \$1,000.

In Favor: J. Bowsza, D. Nelson, S. Dearborn and R. Pippin Opposed: None Motion: PASSED

MOTION made by (Pippin) and SECONDED by (Dearborn) to remove the \$20,000 from the WHPFD Subsidy line.

In Favor: J. Bowsza, S. Dearborn and R. Pippin Opposed: Nelson Motion: PASSED

#### 910200 – Legal Expense

After reviewing the Legal Expenses submitted budget the Board decided to raise the Labor Relations from \$37,000 to \$60,000 to keep it at \$240,000 for a zero increase, zero decrease.

MOTION made by (Pippin) and SECONDED by (Nelson) to restore 910200 – Legal Expenses back to \$240,000 by raising the Labor Relation line back to \$60,000.

In Favor: J. Bowsza, D. Nelson, S. Dearborn and R. Pippin Opposed: None Motion: PASSED

#### **510400 – Communications**

After reviewing the Communications submitted budget and a brief discussion the Board decided not to make any changes at this time.

MOTION made by (Nelson) and SECONDED by (Pippin) to accept the Communication's budget as submitted, with no changes, at this time.

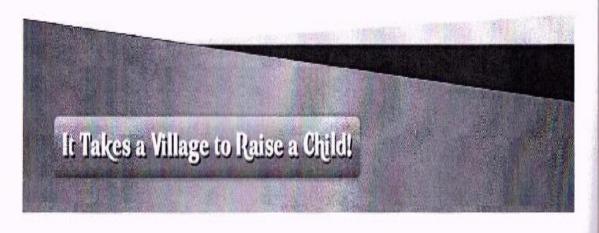
- 1) We are making major changes in early 2017

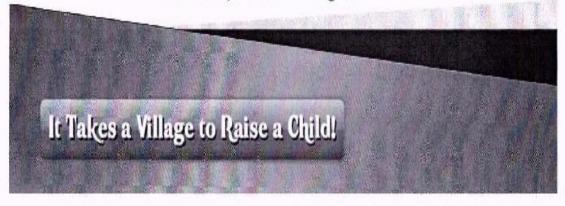
