

EASTHAM COMMUNITY PRESERVATION ACT COMMITTEE

Meeting: February 04, 2010

Meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM by chairman Hank.

Andrew spoke extensively about the Eastham Affordable Housing Trust. He spoke of how the application is to provide housing for people who live and work in Town. In general the committee was concerned about how vague the application was. The applicant was asked to review their application and clarify exactly what the application was for and come back.

Tom, Gloria and Judy spoke of the Historical Society application for a low humidity room. There was discussion of the proposed 12' x 24' room and its construction and how it would meet future needs of the Museum and the storage of their artifacts. They commented that the proposed room should meet their needs for a 'long time' but that it is to be constructed to allow for expansion. Bob Carlson spoke of the cemetery Commission application to restore the Historic Fences at the two cemeteries. The committee had general questions of materials and the installation. The applicant answered our questions.

Herb spoke of the application for the Historic Signage at the CCRT and the Olde Town Centre and Historic Signage and Preservation Awards. He spoke of how the application helped to educate the public. Hank spoke of how we had initially contacted the Coalition to see about how the application meets the Law in regards to funding. Hank will follow up with the Coalition.

There was general discussion of the application for the Historic Signage for the CCRT and the Old Town Centre and Historic Signage and Preservation Awards. Hank will contact Stuart at the CPC to determine if the requested funds meet the Law.

There was a motion by Liz and a second by Bob to adjourn. The vote was 6-0-0.
