Dear Governor Deval Patrick;

I am writing to you for your help in closing or modifying the Eastham, Massachusetts bike path tunnel located on Cape Cod (a high tourist area in the summer months).

On June 27, 2014 my 13 year old son, Ethan Schwartz, while riding the bike path when he picked up speed on his bicycle and lost control of his bike at the 90 degree turn that is at the entrance of the tunnel and collided with 2 other riders, a small child and his father. Luckily they were ok but Ethan was not. He was taken by ambulance to Cape Cod Hospital due to a facial laceration that was deep enough to see his tendon and another deep cut in his knee. Both required 28 stitches. He will most likely have scars on his face and knee, a constant reminder of what has happened to him there. Also important to note is my son has special needs and cannot process what happened to him like other children may be able to due to his learning disabilities.

The Eastham Paramedics, Fire Chief, Police Chief, and Assistant Town Administrator have all told us "accidents happen at that tunnel a lot and it is an issue we have been trying to work on with the state Department of Conservation and Recreation for years without much result." The state has installed 2 signs that are not visible on a bike and the tunnel is extremely dangerous (as you can see from the pictures I have enclosed). The tunnel is enclosed, dark, and there is a sharp turn entering the tunnel and you cannot see it until you are in it. If you are not familiar with the tunnel on this path (as most visitors aren't) you are at high risk of getting into an accident, which does not have to happen.

We need you, as Governor of our State, to help us with this issue before someone dies. And I am convinced someone will die there someday. It is an ongoing problem that appears to have gotten lost in the bureaucracy of state government.

Here are some quotes from both yourself and Rick Sullivan that were made when Secretary of Energy and Environmental Affairs, Rick Sullivan, announced on June 13, 2013 that the Department of Conservation and Recreation Deputy Commissioner would be Jack Murray, effective June 22, 2013.

"<u>Jack has proven himself a strong leader and tireless advocate for the people who use our parks and other public facilities</u>, and I am thrilled to have him lead this important department," said Governor Patrick.

"Jack will be a tremendous asset to our team and the Patrick Administration in his new role. <u>Jack will continue the important work DCR does to protect the Commonwealth's many resources and offer recreational opportunities to residents and visitors</u>," said Secretary Sullivan.

I am a resident of Sandwich, Massachusetts and will do whatever I can as a Cape Cod resident, voter, and mother to be a part of changing this situation. My son and I went back to Eastham on July 1, 2014 and spoke with the Assistant Town Administrator, Fire Chief, Police Chief, and one of the Paramedics who took care of him. I cannot say enough positive things about them as well as Cape Cod Hospital's emergency room, the busiest emergency room in the state during the tourist season. Dr. Rudman is a true asset to Cape Cod Hospital both as a doctor and a person.

Our goal is to prevent further accidents on the Eastham bike path, specifically focusing on the tunnel. I need you, as the top-ranking official in our state, to help make this happen. I invite you to come to Eastham and look for yourself. Please continue to be an advocate for the people of our state and for those who "use our parks and public facilities, including residents and visitors". Ethan and I are counting on you.



Background

One of the Cape Light Compact ("Compact") Board members notified me that his Board of Selectmen questioned the role of Compact member towns and counties in the Compact's Aggregation Plan proceeding before the Department of Public Utilities ("DPU"). As a result, I thought it would be helpful to prepare this memorandum regarding the Compact's involvement and legal representation in the proceeding before the DPU for the review and approval of the Compact's revised Aggregation Plan. The DPU docketed this matter as D.P.U. 14-69.

The Compact Governing Board

In 1997, the Compact was formed by inter-governmental agreement ("IGA") pursuant to G.L. c. 164, §134, G.L. c. 40, §4A after individual town meeting authorizations in each of the Barnstable and Dukes County towns, which became members. Pursuant to the IGA, the member towns and counties have appointed representatives to act on their behalf. See IGA at Article III. The appointed representative is a member of the Compact's Governing Board, and is authorized to act on behalf of his or her appointing Town or County, and acts in accordance with the IGA. See generally, IGA at Articles II through IV. In turn, the Compact Governing Board has delegated the Compact's day-to-day administration and operations to me as the Compact's Administrator.

Background and D.P.U. Procedural History

The Compact's Governing Board voted unanimously to file a revised aggregation plan with the DPU for its review and approval, after engaging in an extensive public review process, including a seven week written comment period and meetings with the Office of the Attorney General and the Department of Energy Resources.

The purpose of the DPU proceeding is to review the revisions to the Compact's aggregation plan, pursuant to a scope of review that is clearly limited by DPU precedent. To date the Attorney General has consistently attempted to broaden the scope of the proceeding and relitigate issues it has lost in two other aggregation cases (Lowell and Hampshire Council of Governments). The Compact has opposed these efforts because the Compact believes it is following the directive of the DPU as well as the intent of the enabling legislation and prior decisions. The Attorney General has appealed the Compact's objections to the DPU. The DPU will decide on what information is to be

provided by the Compact in this proceeding and the Compact will comply with the DPU's decision.

The Compact is not attempting to withhold information. The Compact has previously stated by telephone, in a meeting with representatives of the Attorney General and in a letter dated July 11, 2014, that it is willing to continue to meet with the Office of the Attorney General and provide information and/or documents on matters that are outside the scope of this proceeding, including any information that relates to a request by the Barnstable County Assembly of Delegates relative to the Compact. The Attorney General has declined all of the Compact's offers.

The legal strategies and related legal decisions pertaining to D.P.U. 14-69 have been discussed by and among the Compact Governing Board, the Compact's legal counsel (BCK Law, P.C.) and Compact staff during executive sessions convened during the Governing Board's regularly scheduled Board meetings and in written communications. The Compact Governing Board has been regularly informed, supports and has, directly or through me, authorized the Compact's legal positions in this proceeding. During the public portions of the Compact's Board meetings, I have provided periodic updates on the status of the proceeding.

Compact's Legal Counsel

BCK Law, P.C. ("BCK") is counsel to the Compact, which consists of the twenty-one member towns and two counties acting together pursuant to the IGA. It is *not* counsel to the individual member towns or counties with respect to Compact matters. For the past seventeen years (17), the language included in virtually all of the documents prepared by BCK on behalf of the Compact submitted to regulatory agencies (with copies sometimes sent to other town officials including town counsel), is as follows (indicating of course the particular filing at issue):

On behalf of the towns of Aquinnah, Barnstable, Bourne, Brewster, Chatham, Chilmark, Dennis, Edgartown, Eastham, Falmouth, Harwich, Mashpee, Oak Bluffs, Orleans, Provincetown, Sandwich, Tisbury, Truro, West Tisbury, Wellfleet, and Yarmouth, and the counties of Barnstable and Dukes County, acting together as the Cape Light Compact (the "Compact"), please accept this letter as the Compact's response in opposition to the Office of the Attorney General's ("Attorney General") Motion Seeking Leave to File Reply Comments ("Motion") filed on July 3, 2014 with the DPU of Public Utilities' (the "DPU") in the above referenced proceeding.

See, e.g., <u>Compact Response</u> to AG's Motion Seeking Leave to Reply filed July 8, 2014, D.P.U. 14-69.

The operative and important language is underlined. The clause "acting together as the Cape Light Compact" modifies the listing of the individual towns. If BCK was retained on behalf of the individual towns for these matters this clause would state "individually and acting together as the Cape Light Compact." The wording as it stands

clearly means that BCK is representing the Compact, which consists of the 21 towns and two counties, as listed, and operating together pursuant to the IGA.

It should also be noted that the DPU itself in all proceedings involving the Compact, lists each of the towns and counties and then states "acting together as the Cape Light Compact."

If you, or your Board/Council, have any questions about this issue or would like to discuss the Compact's Aggregation Plan further, please let me know and I will be available to meet.

BASIS FOR FEE

- Fees are set based on the cost to provide the service and the market rate (fees set by other towns).
- Data to Support Cost Basis: The FY 15 Fire and Emergency Medical Services budget is \$1,965,697. There are over 1300 one way trips between Eastham and Cape Cod Hospital each year. \$580,000 in ambulance fee revenue is collected from Medicare (54%), Medicaid (12%), Blue Cross / Blue Shield (10%), Commercial Insurance (14%), Private Pay (6%), Motor Vehicle Insurance (4%).

Estimated Revenue Increase from Proposed Fee Change: Based on October 2013, monthly revenue from ambulance fees would have increased from \$44,218 to \$56,248 if the proposed rates were in effect. The increase in annual revenue would therefore be \$12,000+/- per month due to seasonal variation in ambulance calls.

Billing: Done through a contract with Coastal Billing. Collection rate is 95+%. Over 3 years \$34,000 was uncollectible. The Fire Chief has the authority to abate bills for hardship. "Balance billing" billing to individuals is done to collect the part of the fee insurance does not cover. There will be some increase in uncollectibles / hardship from the new fee schedule. (Attached is patient billing process)

Billing Process

Coastal will invoice all insurance companies directly. Insurance information and a scenario of the call, with diagnosis and treatment, are used for preparing appropriate forms for billing. The CMS 1500 form is widely accepted by major insurers such as Medicare, HMO's, Workers Compensation and Motor Vehicle Accident claims. If an insurer needs a form other that those listed, Coastal will comply with the insurer's requirements.

Before billing a patient privately, Coastal searches several electronic insurance verification systems to obtain up-to-date insurance available for billing. In the case of motor vehicle accidents, we call the patient or the police department to obtain their auto insurance information.

Coastal's private invoices are itemized invoices. Our invoice includes our toll free number and our website information, and our hours of operation. We are always willing to assist a patient during business hours.

If insurance information is not available, Coastal will invoice the patient directly to obtain any insurance information. Our private pay patients receive a request with the first private pay invoice for insurance information and signature, if needed. Our invoice includes places on the form to fill out for various types of insurance information. A note on the invoice requests that the patient fill out the applicable insurance information on the form and return to Coastal. A pre-addressed return envelope is included with all private pay invoices. We also offer the option for patients to enter their insurance information on our website, www.coastalbilling.com.

The private patient will receive an initial bill. If there is no response to that bill the patient will receive a bill thirty and then sixty days later. At ninety days, the patient will receive a letter on bright pink paper requesting a response to our request for insurance information or payment, there is a form on the back of this letter for the patient to provide insurance information. After 15 days one last bill is sent to the patient informing them their account is pending collection.

If Coastal receives a call or email from a patient indicating that they are uninsured or underinsured, we first offer the patient a time payment plan. If they are unable to afford a time payment plan, they are instructed to send us a letter stating their inability to pay the bill and request the bill be abated. These letters are forwarded to the Chief for review and approval for abatement. Eastham does not use the services of a collection agency.

On behalf of the Board of Selectmen, I write to follow up on the June 13, 2014 letter from Town Administrator Sheila Vanderhoef regarding Nauset Spit. The Board discussed the matter at their meeting on July 9th and would propose a joint meeting be scheduled for Wednesday, September 10th at 6:30 pm in Orleans.

In advance of the joint meeting, the Board has requested they receive confirmation that the Eastham Board of Selectmen will support the filing of a Notice of Intent by the Town of Orleans seeking an Order of Conditions to permit Orleans to continue to manage its property on Nauset Spit as we have historically done including the operation of an off road vehicle (ORV) program.

Finally, with respect to the status of the warning sign that Orleans had posted at the Town boundary line on Nauset Spit, the sign disappeared during the overnight hours soon after installation. Unfortunately, a recent Cape Codder article incorrectly reported that the Board voted to take the sign down, when the actual vote was not to replace the sign due to recurring vandalism concerns.
