At a public meeting held on Monday, August 18, 2014, the Board of Selectmen voted to establish a gift fund under the provision of M.G.L. Chapter 44, Section 53A, for the purposes as outlined below. Said fund is to be known as the Fresh Water Support Fund.

Fresh Water Support Fund

The Board of Selectmen, in accordance with M.G.L. Chapter 44, Section 53A, hereby establishes a gift fund to be known as the "Fresh Water Pond Support Fund" to accept funds from any and all individuals, clubs, private non-profits, or corporations interested in supporting the maintenance, water quality improvement projects, educational materials and enhanced access and use to Eastham's fresh water ponds. Expenditure of funds within such account shall be made upon the recommendation of the Town Administrator, the Health Agent and the approval of the Board of Selectmen.

Dear Selectmen,

As you are no doubt aware, the town of Eastham is actively engaged in the development of a partial municipal water system. This portion will provide enhanced fire protection to approximately 80% of Eastham properties and water service opportunity to approximately 2000 properties. Our focus in this portion of the development is the installation of the system "backbone" that can be expanded to serve all properties in town should the voters choose to do so.

We would like to discuss the provision of an emergency interconnect between the Orleans and Eastham systems. State guidelines on water systems encourage the provision of emergency interconnects. The interconnect could serve as a drinking water source in an emergency, for either system, if needed. The current concept plan shows the interconnect occurring in Orleans, south of the Rotary in the general area of the Courthouse where you currently have water service. Before we proceed to final design of this area, we would like to discuss with you the potential for this interconnect and how it might benefit both towns.

We already have a joint meeting scheduled for September 10 and could add this to the agenda at that time or we can schedule a separate meeting to discuss this. We would have our engineer attend any discussion to assist in answering any technical questions you or your staff may have.

We look forward to hearing from you soon on this matter.

Dear Selectmen,

This letter is to confirm the attendance of the Eastham Board of Selectmen on the September 10, 2014 scheduled joint meeting at 6:30 p.m. at the Orleans Town Hall. The primary topic for discussion will be the use of the Nauset Spit by off road vehicles.

Our local Conservation Commission has issued an order to "cease and desist" in the use of this area by vehicles. The order will be issued to the Town of Orleans due to the management of your staff that invites users to the area and the vehicle patrols by that staff. The Town has also issued an order to the National Park Service as they have plans that indicate they are the owner of a portion of the impacted beach area. And finally our local Conservation Commission has notified your Conservation Commission of the violation of the limitations of their order to use the beach for off road vehicles. We read that order to be limited to land within the Town of Orleans.

We understand that both Boards are getting pressure in both directions on this issue and hope to use our time to begin to develop a use strategy that is jointly supported and consistent with the laws and regulations in each town where the land is located.
