Dear Sheila and Jacqueline,

\*\*\* Please forgive the "form" email below. I'm writing to several towns right now, and it was simpler. Brewster signed on immediately after our meeting with your board last week!! \*\*\*

At the request of Laura Kelley, Director of Protect Our Cape Cod Aquifer ("POCCA"), I am writing to you in my capacity as POCCA's Government Liaison with a request to appear on a BOS agenda in the immediate future. The subject is the Massachusetts Department of Agricultural Resources' ("MDAR") pending decision on Eversource's 2016 Yearly Operational Plan (the "YOP"). A description of our presentation and requested actions appears below.

POCCA is actively engaged in building a coalition of Lower Cape municipalities to request an Adjudicatory Hearing before the Massachusetts Pesticide Board should MDAR approve Eversource's 2016 YOP. We believe that the Pesticide Board has failed in its mission to competently advise MDAR on pesticide matters. POCCA has researched what course of action an aggrieved party (in this case the citizens of Cape Cod) may take in order to right this wrong. We believe that the next step is for one or more Cape Cod municipalities to request an Adjudicatory Hearing and make our case.

At their meeting on June 20, 2016, The Brewster Board of Selectmen acted on three motions, presented to them by POCCA, in order to pursue the process described above. Namely, Brewster has voted affirmatively to:

- 1. Request an Adjudicatory Hearing before the Massachusetts Pesticide Board should MDAR approve Eversource's 2016 YOP.
- 2. Appoint Attorney Bruce Taub as special counsel representing the town "on matters pertaining to the application of pesticides and/or herbicides on or about the Eversource right-of-way, and to represent the town at the Adjudicatory Hearing before the Massachusetts Pesticide Board."
- 3. Authorize the Town Administrator to expend, from the town's legal budget, an amount not to exceed \$15,000.00, for all matters related to the Adjudicatory Hearing before the Massachusetts Pesticide Board.

I have attached the three motions drafted by POCCA, and voted affirmatively on by Brewster, to this email. Please note that the \$15,000 is derived from our estimated budget of \$60,000 (shared by four towns). This budget is designed to carry this effort through a decision at the Adjudicatory Hearing.

It is critically important to note that POCCA has successfully engaged Dr. John Stark, Ph.D., Professor and Director of the Ecotoxicology Program at Washington State University (short form CV attached) to act as an expert witness during the Adjudicatory Hearing process.

Our time is limited, as the towns will have only 21 days after MDAR issues its decision on the YOP during which to request the Adjudicatory Hearing. Our hope is that Eastham joins Brewster in this effort by voting affirmatively on the attached motions. We are also pursuing this effort with Chatham, Orleans, and Dennis.







The Town Administrator shall appoint, on the basis of merit and fitness alone, and may remove, except as otherwise provided by General Laws, this Charter, personnel bylaws, or collective bargaining agreements that may be applicable, a Town Treasurer/Collector, a Police Chief, a Fire Chief, a Town Accountant, and all other department heads, officers, subordinates and employees, full- and part-time, excepting that:

A.

Employees of the School Department and the Library shall be appointed by their respective department heads;

B.

The Police Chief and Fire Chief shall appoint employees of their respective departments subject to the approval of the Town Administrator;

C.

The Town Administrator shall appoint personnel after consultation with supervisors and department heads to whom such personnel report or are assigned;

D.

With the exception of the appointment of the Town Treasurer/Collector, all appointments made or approved by the Town Administrator shall become effective no later than the 15th day following the day on which notice of the proposed appointment is filed with the Board of Selectmen, unless three members of the Board of Selectmen shall vote to reject such an appointment within such period.

E.

Appointment of the Town Treasurer/Collector shall become effective no later than the 15th day following the day on which notice of the proposed appointment is filed with the Finance Committee and the Board of Selectmen, unless five members of the Finance Committee and three members of the Board of Selectmen shall vote to reject such an appointment within such period.<sup>[1]</sup>

In light of the continued gun violence in the United States and the increased use of high power assault weapons by civilians, most notably the June 12, 2016 attack in Orlando, Florida that murdered 49 and wounded 53 innocent people, the Board of Selectmen for the Town of Eastham, calls upon you to take immediate action through legislation to take steps to make it more difficult for civilians to gain access to these types of weapons.

We understand that civilian ownership of machine guns and assault rifles has been tightly regulated since 1934 under the National Firearms Act and since 1986 under the Firearm Owners Protection Act. However, since the expiration of the Federal Assault Weapons Ban of 1994, we have seen an increase in and the dramatic and horrific use of weapons designed for military use being turned against our most vulnerable citizens in places such as schools, workplaces, and social venues.

On June 20, 2016, as a Board we voted 4-1 to ask specifically for:

- the reinstatement of the Federal Assault Weapons Ban of 1994;
- strict prohibitions on the purchase of guns by suspected terrorists;
- and an expansion and tightening of background checks prior to the purchase of weapons.

Thank you in advance for your quick consideration and action regarding this matter.

## The New Public Records Law - Municipalities

On June 3, 2016, the Legislature enacted, "An Act to Improve Public Records", Chapter 121 of the Acts of 2016 (<a href="https://malegislature.gov/Laws/SessionLaws/Acts/2016/Chapter121">https://malegislature.gov/Laws/SessionLaws/Acts/2016/Chapter121</a>). Chapter 121 makes significant changes to the Public Records Law, and as a result, public entities throughout the state will need to adjust their public records practices. Importantly, however, the new requirements will not take effect until January 1, 2017. The outline that follows is therefore for general information purposes only.

Note that different requirements and timelines apply to municipalities as compared to other types of entities. At this time, however, it is not clear whether districts and authorities providing municipal services will be treated as municipalities for purposes of the law. We will provide separate guidance to such entities as may be needed.

## (1) Changes to Exemptions

- The new law amends Exemption (n) to allow records to be withheld related to cyber security;
- Exemptions (o) and (p), and other provisions of law relative to the public records status of home addresses and telephone numbers of certain public employees, public safety personnel, victims of adjudicated crimes, and their family members' names and personal information, have been revised to allow withholding of personal e-mail addresses; and
- The names and addresses of persons who own, possess, or are licensed to carry firearms will not be subject to disclosure, other than in particular situations.

## (2) Appointment and Duties of Records Access Officer ("RAO")

- The RAO is the municipal clerk and any others appointed by the "chief executive officer";
- The RAO will assist public records requesters, assist records custodians in maintaining records, and prepare guidelines as to the public records request and response process;
- Contact information for each RAO and the guidelines must be posted to the official website;

### (3) Responses to Requests

- The time to provide an initial written response has increased from 10 <u>calendar</u> days to 10 <u>business</u> days;
- The new law expressly authorizes requests by hand, first class mail and e-mail; the law does not expressly address in person verbal requests and we are uncertain whether the Supervisor's regulations will address this issue;
- If a complete response cannot be provided within the initial time frame, the RAO must still respond to confirm receipt, either explaining why a complete response cannot be provided, directing the requester to a different custodian, outlining what will be withheld if known, and estimating the time for response;



- For municipalities, the law establishes an outside date to provide the requested records <u>not to</u>
   exceed 25 <u>business days</u> from the date of the initial request, although the requester can agree
   to more;
- The RAO may ask the Supervisor to grant 30 additional business days for "good cause shown";
- "Good cause shown" will be evaluated based upon a variety of factors including: time needed to search for and redact the record(s); office hours; capacity of the office; number of requests; and whether the request is part of a series that are frivolous, intended to intimidate or harass;
- The law establishes a preference for electronic copies, unless the requester specifically dictates otherwise, and, to the extent feasible, documents must be posted on the municipal website.

## (4) Fees

- A reasonable fee may be assessed for production of records other than those "freely
  available for public inspection" (such as on a website) ONLY if the RAO responds to the
  request within 10 business days;
- The fee for copies of records shall not exceed the actual cost for reproducing the record, and shall, unless otherwise provided, be calculated as follows: the actual cost of storage device; for black and white photocopies or computer printouts, no more than \$.05/page, whether single or double-sided (the Supervisor's Public Records Fee Access Regulations are already reflective of this requirement)
- For responses requiring <u>two hours or less</u>, it appears no fee may be assessed for "employee time":
- If more than two hours of work will be required to look for, compile, segregate, redact or reproduce the record, the prorated hourly fee of the lowest paid person capable of doing the work, capped at \$25.00/hour, can be charged; provided, however, that, in a municipality of more than 20,000 people, no charge may be made for the first two hours;
- Subject to the cap, "employee time" may include that required by employees or "necessary vendors, including outside legal counsel, technology and payroll consultants or others as needed by the municipality";
- The RAO may petition the Supervisor for permission to charge a higher hourly rate, and the
  Supervisor has five business days to respond; permission may be granted upon a finding that
  the request is for a commercial purpose OR that the request cannot be prudently completed
  without the redaction, and the amount of the fee is reasonable and not intended to limit,
  deter or prevent access; factors to be considered include public interest in access to the
  record and financial ability of the requester to pay;
- Unlike now, police records are subject to the same fee schedule as other records;
- The RAO may deny additional requests from requesters that have failed to pay for previous requests, provided that the requester is provided with an accounting of outstanding balances;
- As is the case now, the RAO may not require the requester to specify the purposes for the request; <a href="https://however">however</a>, under the new law, a request for additional information may be made to determine whether the request is made for a commercial purpose (sale or resale of a portion of the record or use of the information to advance strategic business interests, and not for news purposes or to better understand government operations) or to grant a fee waiver.



### (5) Appeals

- By Requester to Supervisor or Superior Court Appeals may be made to the Supervisor who shall issue a written decision within 10 business days of receipt of the petition; a requester aggrieved by a decision of the Supervisor may obtain judicial review in Superior Court OR the requester can go directly to court
- By Attorney General The Attorney General, at the request of the Supervisor, may seek to compel disclosure of records; the Attorney General may also act on its own initiative or intervene in case filed by requester;
- <u>All records are presumed to be public</u>, and burden is on municipality to show, by a preponderance of the evidence, that the record or portion thereof may be withheld;

### (6) Attorneys' Fees

- Presumption in favor of an award of costs and attorneys' fees \_\_ The new law requires an
  award to be made in any case in which the requester "obtains relief through a judicial order,
  consent decree, or the provision of the requested documents after the filing of a complaint";
  - o **To combat the presumption**, the municipality must establish that (1) the Supervisor found in favor of the municipality, (2) the municipality relied upon an appellate level decision or a published opinion of the Attorney General based upon similar facts, or (3) request was designed to harass or intimidate or was not in the public interest and made for commercial purposes unrelated to provision of information to the public; thus, if an exemption is asserted, and the court orders any portion of the records to be released OR any portion of the records are released after the filing of litigation, a presumption exists that the plaintiff will be awarded attorneys' fees and costs;
- **Waiver of Fees** If attorneys' fees and costs are awarded, the Superior Court shall order the municipality to waive fees assessed for copies of the records; if no such award is made, the court may still require the municipality to waive such fees;
- **Punitive Damages** The Superior Court may award punitive damages of no less than \$1,000 and no more than \$5,000 if the requester has obtained judgment in Superior Court and has demonstrated that the municipality failed to act in good faith.

**Summary**. This eUpdate identifies certain significant changes to the Public Records Law for your immediate information. It will be important to plan for these changes in the law, including appointment of RAOs. In addition to provision of additional written guidance, this fall we will hold approximately a dozen client training sessions throughout the state. The dates and locations for such training sessions will be announced shortly.

I am pleased to notify you that on June 22, 2016, the Department of the Interior issued payments to eligible local governments under the Payments in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) program. The PILT program compensates local jurisdictions for Federal lands administered by agencies within the Department and on behalf of the U.S. Forest Service and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Local governments may use the PILT payments for any governmental purpose, including important community services such as emergency response, public schools, and roads. Since counties and other local jurisdictions cannot tax Federal lands, annual PILT payments help to defray costs associated with maintaining services that support these lands within their boundaries.

The Payments in Lieu of Taxes Act, 31 U.S.C. 6901-6907, as amended, authorized the program. The PILT Act prescribes the formula used to compute the annual payments based on per acre and population variables, which are annually adjusted for inflation and census data. Prior year Federal payments under certain revenue sharing programs are deducted in formulating the payment amounts. States report these amounts through an annual reporting process. A provision in the PILT Act provides that temporary payments be made to compensate for recent additions to the National Park System and National Forest Wilderness areas.

The President signed the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2016 (P.L.114-113) on December 18, 2015, providing funding for the 2016 PILT program. Approximately 1,900 local jurisdictions received a total of \$451.6 million in PILT payments this year.

For 2016, your county is receiving a PILT payment of \$6,048.00. If you provided current bank routing and account numbers for your county to our Interior Business Center office or to SAM (System of Awards Management), an electronic funds transfer was posted to your account on or about June 22, 2016. If this information was not available, a check was mailed to your county's address of record from the U.S. Treasury. Should you require further information, points of contact are provided in the list of Frequently Asked Questions at www.doi.gov/pilt. The website also includes information on how to register in SAM to expedite receipt of future PILT payments. Please contact the PILT Program Manager, Dionna Kiernan, at (202) 513-7783, if you have any questions.

Ladies & Gentlemen:

The Division of Marine Fisheries has determined that **bivalve shellfish** from area OC:6, (Salt Pond in the Town of Eastham) defined below, **no longer contain biotoxins** (**Paralytic Shellfish Poison-(PSP)**) from the phytoplankton *Alexandrium* (*spp.*) in excess of established standards. All areas in the Nauset system (OC:2 through OC:6) remain closed to the harvesting of **Moon snails** (*Polinices duplicatus and Lunatia heros*).

Therefore, under authority of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 130, sections 74A and 75 and 322 CMR sections 7.01 (7), 7.02 and 10.00, the PSP closure for **bivalve shellfish** issued on April 7, 2016 **will be rescinded at sunrise on June 24, 2016** in area OC:6 (Salt Pond). Bivalve shellfish in areas currently classified as APPROVED and in the "open" status may now be harvested for direct human consumption subject to local rules and regulations under authority of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 130, section 52. Similarly, those areas classified as CONDTIONALLY APPROVED and in the "open" status are subject to the classification conditions. All areas OC:2 through OC:6 remain closed to the harvesting of **Moon snails** (*Polinices duplicatus and Lunatia heros*).

Status: Open to Bivalve Shellfish Harvesting. This area remains closed to the harvesting of Moon snails (*Polinices duplicatus and Lunatia heros*).

Dear Mr. McClean,

We are writing again to restate our concern about the Eversource YOP that continues to focus on chemical vegetation management strategies.

The Board of Selectmen continues to feel strongly that vegetation control techniques in Eastham, and everywhere on the Cape, should be limited to non-chemical applications such as hand-cutting and Integrated Vegetation Management (IVM) techniques.

The Town of Eastham is currently in the process of developing and permitting a public water supply. Currently, all properties abutting the NSTAR/EverSource transmission corridor are served by on-site wells and septic systems. We have reviewed the maps sent with the letter and wells with 50' or less separation are marked on your current maps, but we also want you to be aware of the many wells within the 100' separation. We have located all of these private drinking water wells with GPS coordinates, and will forward those files to you should you want to refine the private locations shown on the map with specific coordinates.

Eastham strongly objects to the state's acceptance of the YOP for the following reasons:

- 1. The chemicals used are toxins which go into the soil that is covering our sole source aquifer
- 2. These same toxins have potential adverse impacts on the above ground environment, bee populations and plants
- 3. MDAR, in continuing to support chemical vegetation control measures, shows a lack of concern for the special environment with the sole source aquifer on Cape Cod

In summary, we hope you are concerned as well, and will do everything possible to ensure that our water supply, our fragile environment, and the health of our citizens, are protected.


