Enfield Energy Committee minutes special meeting February 7, 2017

The sole agenda item for this meeting was a comparison of the three PPA proposals sent by ReVision Energy, Norwich Technologies and Energy Emporium. In spite of an effort to format the proposals in our RFP, they were quite different in form as well as content and therefore, hard to compare.

The Committee chose to invite ReVision to send a contract for the following reasons:

- lowest PPA rate and the biggest discount to the utility rate: 16%-25% based on past, current and projected utility rate schedule. Only one to consult current rate schedule.
- clear rate and projected savings schedule going out 40 years.
- estimated cost of 7th year buyout and offered to finance it.
- savings based on realistic utility rate increases, 2.5% annually.
- output projection closest to supplying most of DPW needs.
- thorough site inspection.

Other business:

Charlie Clark is proceeding with lighting upgrade work orders for the library and police station.

Holly brought up the solid waste situation in Enfield. There is a need to reduce Casella's escalating costs and questionable environmental/ energy benefit. Terracycle is an individual fee-based program for diverting non-recyclable solid waste at the source. Other local transfer station programs might involve food waste and construction materials.
