JUNE 23 MINUTES

ENFIELD HERITAGE COMMISSION

Minutes of May 24 meeting were approved.

Meredith Smith reported on the EVA Historic Marker project. She will be working with the EVA Design Committee (and as a Design Committee member) to create a series of permanent markers, identifying important historic sites and buildings along Main Street. Marjorie Carr and Mary Ann Haagan have identified several properties, which will be eligible for such markers. They are: Library/Town Offices Building, Lutheran (Universalist) Church, Ann Tarney's House, Copeland Block, Enfield Advocate Building, Fogg's Hardware (Sanford Building), the Shaker Granary site, and the Triangle Store Building. There will be six locations chosen for markers to begin the project and more added as funding allows.

A discussion was held regarding the Enfield Center Town Hall and possible appropriate locations for the building. Nancy Scovner was asked to look into town owned lands as possible new sites for the building.

Mary Ann Haagan reported on the Museum's move to the Great Stone Dwelling. There will be exhibits on the first two floors and the shop will be located on the ground floor. Guest rooms will remain on the third and fourth floors and the library will be located on the fifth floor. Mary Ann reports that the move has gone smoothly, although there is still plenty of work to be done, should anyone have a few spare hours!

Due to the length of the meeting, a discussion of the proposed design guidelines was postponed till the next meeting.
