Minutes of the meeting for **April 3, 2014**>at the BPW Administration Building, Arsene St., Fairhaven, MA

Members in attendance:

Chairman called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM. The meeting was not recorded by government access TV. Chairman has to be notified if anyone present is recording the meeting by video or audio.

Motion made by Terry to accept the minutes from March 27, 2014. Seconded by Scott. Vote: Unanimous

- Mr. Osuch passes out updated FY15 spreadsheet, updated warrant for the ATM, updated spreadsheet for the ATM Articles, updated warrant for the STM, updated spreadsheet for the STM, and material for CPC STM Article for Academy roof.
- Chairman passes out Article 15 and Article 31 from the TGSC. The committee will be in next week.
 - Chairman states that the Selectmen have taken over the Capital Planning Article. Mr. Espindola will be in at some point to address the committee.
- Chairman states that the Academy roof project is now in the Special Town Meeting, using CPC funds.
- Chairman also passes out information from Mr. Kitchen for the HMS floor tile project, and the President's letter from the Association of Town Finance Committees.

- Chairman presents a Reserve Fund Transfer request from the Town Clerk for Election & Registration Payroll in the amount of \$ 5,837.52.
 - The money is needed because of the extra election in September 2013.
 - Scott motions to transfer \$ 5,837.52 to Acct. #01-163-00-5111-00 Office Salary. Seconded by Terry. Vote: Unanimous.
- Chairman presents a letter from Albert Benac explaining his Fine Arts budget.
- Chairman presents a Reserve Fund Transfer request from the Fire Chief for damage incurred in the fire station basement, in the amount of \$ 10,000.
 - Chief Francis states that the money is needed to cover the insurance deductable, for damage caused by the recent sewer back-up.
 - ➤ Terry motions to transfer \$ 10,000 allocated in the following amounts:

- Seconded by Scott. Vote: Unanimous
- Chairman advises Chief Francis to file a Reserve Fund Transfer request for each category next time.
- Chief explains that they have been advised to clean the sewer line on a regular basis from now on. The sewer line may need to be replaced or relined in the near future.
- Chief Francis presents the Fire Department budget:
 - Chief Francis states that the salary includes the increase for longevity only, at this point, because the contracts have not been settled.
 - Chief states that the union is close to settling.
 - Chief states that the increase for the executive assistant is included as per the Selectmen and Personnel Board.
 - The salary increase of \$ 7,932 will come from the Ambulance Fund.
 - Medical expense has been moved to Town Insurance.
 - Gasoline has been increased because of the 3rd ambulance.
 - Chairman asks why the copier purchase is not under Capital Outlay, instead of an Article.

Chairman asks the Chief if he had considered leasing the copier.

- Chief states that he thought this was the way to do it.
- o Chief states that the present machine was bought as a demo model in 1995.

- Chief states that he checked with three vendors, none recommended leasing, and the price they are going with is the same vendor that supplies Town Hall.
- Scott questions the executive assistant position.
 - Chief Francis states the position is going from 35 to 40 hours a week. There will no longer be overtime needed to do the ambulance billing.
 - The position was reclassified.
 - Chairman states that the position should not have been reclassified once the budget process was started.
- Pat questions medical supplies being raised \$ 5,000.
 - Chief states that it is because of the 3rd ambulance.
- Terry asks if the 3rd ambulance is making money.
 - o Chief states that it is but he doesn't have the figures with him.
 - Chief states that this year \$ 766,000 will come from the Ambulance Fund, to fund the service. The Ambulance Fund will be close to maxed out this year.
- Discussion between Chairman and Chief Francis about doing a true accounting of the cost of service for the ambulances.
- Chairman tells the Chief that the committee needs to get the contract early enough to go over it before Town Meeting.
- Discussion of the Fire Alarm Department budget.
- Discussion of Article 8- Fire Dept. roof.
 - Chairman asks if we should put money into the building, if the Police & Fire Dept. are not staying there.
 - Chief states that even if they were to move to another building, this is a good building and could be used by some other department to store their equipment out of the weather.
 - Chairman states that the only way a new building could be funded, is with a debt exclusion.
 - Chairman states that the High School debt exclusion won't be retired until 2017 and even at that point he doesn't see the Town voting for it.
 - Chief states that the roof is currently leaking in the dispatch area.
- Discussion of Article 9- FEMA Grant for Ladder 1
 - Matching grant to replace Ladder 1.
 - Requires the Town to pay 5% of cost.
- Discussion of Article 13- FEMA Grant for Firefighter Gear

- Matching grant to replace 10 year old gear
- Same grant was used to replace the gear 10 years ago.
- Chief states that he should know before Town Meeting if he is getting either grant.
- Pat asks if the new Ladder Truck will fit in the station.
 - Chief states yes, it is the same size as the present truck.
- Discussion of Article 1.-4a. Fire Dept. Salary and Wages, on the STM.
 - Chief states that \$ 30,000 is needed to cover the overtime, because they had 5 people who were injured.
 - Chief states they have had to cover more injuries this year than ever before.
- Chief states that he has 1 man leaving on deployment in the military, but is bringing up a call fire fighter for 400 days to cover him.

7:59 PM. Chairman calls a recess. Chief Francis leaves the meeting. Back in session @ 8:06 PM.

 - Mr. Osuch states there still is no agreement with the Treasurer concerning the Collector position.
 - Terry asks if we should still vote without an agreement.
 - Chairman states that this is different, it is an administrative position, and this is what the Selectmen feel the position is worth.

- Chairman states that the bulk mail now must be driven to the New Bedford post office.
- Even though it is more work, it saves 10 cents per item mailed, which adds up.
- Discussion of why the senior clerk is at the top step.
 - Mr. Osuch states they expect an employee to bid on the position.
- Pat questions the postage number.
 - o Chairman states that they have reduced it some and we will watch it.
 - Chairman states that no one wants to take it to New Bedford to save the postage.
 He states that the management of the office is out of Town Hall enough, and could drop it off.
 - Next year we will have to look closely at the mailing. 10 cents savings, per mailing, adds up with the large volume.
