

Fairhaven Historical Commission

November 6, 2013 Meeting Minutes

Present: Chairman David Despres, Members Cynthia McNaughten, Chuck Cromwell, and Wayne Oliveira, Associate members Vicki Paquette and Anne Kakley, and resident Gary Lavalette.

Chairman Despres declared a quorum and called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Academy Building classroom.

MINUTES

The minutes of the October 2, 2013 meeting were read into record. Mr. Cromwell motioned to approve the minutes. Ms. Paquette seconded. Vote was unanimous.

FINANCIAL REPORT

The Commission approved the Financial Report as read by the Chairman. Mr. Cromwell motioned to approve the Financial Report. Ms. Paquette seconded. Vote was unanimous.

ACADEMY BUILDING

CPC Shade project – The Commission has received some quotes for window shade replacements at the Academy Building. The quote is for about \$2,000 and the Commission will submit an application to the Community Preservation Committee for the funds to complete the work. See Attachment A for the "Academy Building Window Shade Project" application.

Mr. Despres motioned to send the window shade application to the CPC for consideration. Mr. Oliveira seconded. Vote was unanimous.

FIRE MUSEUM

Mr. Oliveira said that he was working on getting some quotes for interior work at the Fire Museum, so he could complete due diligence in accordance with state procurement law. He was having difficulty getting all the quotes he needed for the interior woodwork and the electrical work. Discussion ensued on fulfilling the requirements of 30b procurement.

Mr. Despres motioned to send the application for \$11,000 for the Fire Museum to the CPC for consideration. Mr. Oliveira seconded. Vote was unanimous.

FORT PHOENIX

Mr. Cromwell and Mr. Lavalette met at the Fort and are working on a way to keep the flag flying at Fort Phoenix year round.

COMMISSION MEMBERSHIP

Mr. Cromwell said that he would like to see Mr. Lavalette join the Commission. Discussion ensued on membership and Ms. Kakley informed the Commission that Albert Benac had asked to join the Commission in 2012. Ms. Kakley said that if the Commission would request Mr. Lavalette's appointment, it should consider Mr. Benac's as well.

Mr. Despres expressed upset over the fact that the Commission had never been informed of Mr. Benac's interest. He said that he would welcome any members. Mr. Lavalette asked if his line of work would present an issue when working with the Commission to do improvements to the historical structures. Ms. Kakley said that if Mr. Lavalette were concerned, he could file a disclosure form with the Town Clerk's office.

In regards to membership, the Commission discussed the possibility of re-appointing full member Gail Isaksen as an Associate member at renewal time, as she rarely attends meetings and it would free up her full membership to a more active member.

OLD STONE SCHOOLHOUSE

Donald Wunschel will oil the gutters of the Old Stone Schoolhouse in fall when all the leaves have fallen.

CORRESPONDENCE

The Commission received a letter from a gentleman in Richmond, VA asking if there were any 18th century structures about to be razed.

FORT PHOENIX SECURITY

Mr. Lavalette said that he has been working with the Police department to increase security at the Fort, thereby keeping it cleaner and reducing crime. The Police have agreed to start locking the gate there at 10:30 p.m. He said that the location needs more lighting. Mr. Lavalette will look into the pole at the Town side of Fort Phoenix and will report back to the Commission at their December meeting.

HOUSE PLAQUES

Ms. McNaughten said that the Commission needs to start taking better control of the house plaque program, and not expect the Library to administer it. She added that there are historical

inaccuracies in many of the Town house plaques. Discussion ensued.

OTHER BUSINESS

- Mr. Despres motioned to sign bills, totaling \$697.04. Mr. Oliveira seconded. Vote was unanimous.
- The next meeting of the Historical Commission will be August 7, 2013.

Mr. Despres motioned to adjourn at 8:02 p.m. Mr. Cromwell seconded. Vote was unanimous.



FAIRHAVEN ACADEMY BUILDING WINDOW SHADE PROJECT

The Fairhaven Academy Building was built in 1798 as a private academy and was located diagonally across Huttleston Avenue from its present location. It was sold in 1841 to Captain John A. Hawes who utilized the building at various times as a billiard room and meeting place for both religious and Town meetings. In 1907, the Fairhaven High School Alumni Association, at the behest of Henry Huttleston Rogers, purchased the building and moved it to its current location. It has served as a meeting place for the Colonial Club, the Red Cross, the Fairhaven Militia, and also the Fairhaven Historical Society. The Academy is listed on both the Massachusetts and National Historical Registers. Owned by the Town of Fairhaven, the Academy is maintained by the Fairhaven Historical Commission. The Museum of Fairhaven History, administered by the Historical Society, is located in the building.

The project would replace the existing shades at all twenty-five windows. These shades will help preserve the interior surfaces, as well as the contents of the Museum from damaging UV rays.

Estimates are attached, as are photographs showing the condition of the existing shades.

The Historical Commission thanks you in advance for your every consideration of this worthy project.




