Scientists and technicians in Augusta employ some of the most state-of-the-art equipment and instrumentation available to the scientific community to analyze evidence submitted by local law enforcement. The quality and amount of submitted evidence varies by community. This project will contribute to the effectiveness of the State Police Crime Lab by increasing the quality of evidence sent to Augusta and elevating the training and qualifications of evidence technicians in the participating communities.

The State Police Crime Lab has the capacity to analyze evidence submitted by local agencies. Expeditious submission of properly collected and processed evidence will increase the capability of law enforcement to investigate crimes and identify suspects.

It is in the best interests of all agencies charged with the maintenance of public safety to work together to identify suspects and properly prepare criminal cases for prosecution. The Maine State Police Crime Lab looks forward to continued cooperation and collaboration with the agencies participating in the regional crime lab effort.
