2.64 Neighborhood Variety/Convenience Store: A store with up to 3,000 square feet of gross floor space intended to serve a residential neighborhood with a limited variety of foods, beverages and dry goods, including, but not limited to, newspapers, emergency home repair articles and other household items. It may also include the sale of prepared foods, for consumption on or off-site, provided that such sale is accessory to the principal use and does not use drive-through. [Adopted 8/28/06]
