


**7 B. CONCEPTUAL SITE LAYOUT AND ARCHITECTURAL

# LINKAGES & CONNECTIONS

Woods Road is site that sits on the transition between suburban and rural Falmouth. It is a primarily automobile serviced site, currently not served by Metro buslines or other public transportation. It is, however, convenient to the Turnpike, Route 1 services and the Falmouth schools by automobile. If passenger rail were to return to Falmouth, the rail line is located close by across Route 9.

There are no current formal trails located on the site, but there are powerline ATV trails located to the north above the former landfill, and one could imagine a future trail running down the watercourse of the Skitterygussett to Portland Trails' network in construction along the Casco Bay estuary.

## SITE FEATURES



This site is characterized by lowland streams and wetlands and by upland ledge outcroppings. There are remains of historic farm stone walls to the south of the site that run along the highlands. There is very little flat ground on the site, except at the high corner to the southwest, where the trees are mostly deciduous and open.

Some intact groves of Hemlock grow along the ledges to the west of the Skitterygussett Stream, some of which have outlasted several logging regimes.
