SCHOOL BUDGET VALIDATION REFERENDUM
(20-A M.R.S.A. §§ 1486, 1502 and 2307)

TO: Ed Tolan, Chief of Police of the Town of Falmouth: You are hereby required in the name of the State of Maine to notify the voters of the Town of Falmouth of the referendum meeting described in this warrant.

TO THE VOTERS OF THE TOWN OF FALMOUTH:

You are hereby notified that a school budget validation referendum meeting will be held at Falmouth High School, 74 Woodville Road in the Town of Falmouth on Tuesday, June 8, 2010 for the purpose of determining the following questions:

- Question 1: Do you favor approving the Town of Falmouth school budget for the upcoming school year that was adopted at the Town council meeting held May 10, 2010?
- Question 2: Do you wish to continue the budget validation referendum process in the Town of Falmouth for an additional three years?

Informational Note

A “YES” vote will require the Town of Falmouth to continue to conduct a referendum to validate its annual school budget for the next three years.

A “NO” vote will discontinue the budget validation referendum for at least three years and provide instead that the annual school budget shall be finally adopted at a meeting of the municipal council.

The voting on Question 1 and Question 2 shall be by secret ballot referendum and the polls shall be opened at 7:00 a.m. and closed at 8:00 p.m.

The Registrar of Voters shall hold office hours while the polls are open to correct any error in or change a name or address on the voting list; to accept the registration of any person eligible to vote and to accept new enrollments.

A person who is not registered as a voter may not vote in any election.
