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• Replace access bridge.





 Maintain habitat diversity by mowing/burning fields, patch cutting brushy growth to sustain early successional areas.



 Control invasive plant infestations.

Remove house by burning.



 Permanently protect the property with a conservation easement applied as part of a mitigation agreement.

Continue research / educational activities on the property.







 Leave "Forever Wild" with the possible exception of light future harvesting to maintain the hardwood forest community at the north end of the property.



 Acquire an adjacent ±20 acre parcel to provide connectivity to High Lake.

• Build a trail around the southern end of the property that connects to the northern end.





 Build trails connecting Blackstrap Road to the upper portion of the property, including parking area.



- Manage the forest:
 - Create a forest management plan for the former 100-Acre Woods parcel.

 Maintain large tracts of early successional forest.



 Acquire an additional ±100 abutting acres on the southern border.



Blackstrap Hill Community Forest

 Implement forest management plan, harvesting mature trees in the NW corner and creating early successional habitat for New England cottontail rabbits.

- Discourage motorized vehicle use.
- Control invasive plants.





 Continue implementation of the "worst first" forest management plan.

 Acquire additional abutting parcels as they become available.





- Harvest ±15 acres of existing scraggly pine and invasive plants to create early successional New England Cottontail habitat north of Field C.
- Remainder of the property left
 "Forever Wild."
- Control invasive plants.

Limited forest management required to provide winter browse.

Falmouth Nature Preserve

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- A uniform conservation easement should be placed on on all 3 town parcels.
- Invasives need controlling in several locations.

- ±40-acres of the abutting Sukeforth parcel should be acquired when available.
- Is this a park or open space parcel?
