2. <u>Review of Grant Application for the French Property:</u>

3. Dave Connolly had done some preliminary steps prior to tonight's discussion including a visit to the Planning Office and meeting with the selectmen on Monday (9/9/13).

Kathy Menici from the Planning Office went over what she needed and sought clarification from the Conservation Commission about the focus of the grant. Kathy's first major point was that the process was so involved and the amount of work about equal that we might as well go for the \$3500.00 version as the \$750.00 version. Dave informed everyone that N.H. Fish and Game has approved the trail and boardwalk plans for the French property.

Discussion ensued that included the following focal points: reducing erosion, flooding, bog bridge.

Kathy reminded the Commission that there was <u>no</u> match requirement for this grant. Kathy stated that she needed the following as soon as possible: photographs of the skidder trails (Dave told his story of lost and found again with no pictures), estimates of the costs, and trail delineation. Discussion occurred on the following items: sawmill operator and costs, stream crossing and estimates from local contractors, snowmobile bridge, trail markers and use of the Boy Scouts.

Kathy reviews the items to be done and refers to aerial maps and states she needs a amp to be done to show just the skidder trails. Dave asks Rodney Thompson about using his maps. Kathy asks that we go over the questions that she asked including items like the woodcock area, timeline of completion for each item, trail stabilization, removal of slash, bog crossings and erosion control. Kathy reminds the Commission that costs need to be accurate, including official estimates is best.

Rodney cited the trail distance

Discussion on the topic conclude with ideas about publicity and ways to promote the effort on the French property.

4. Old Business:

a) Town Forest

Discussion on the Town Forest included the following:

- The Town Forest is one of four deeded properties to the Town of Farmington that have conservation restrictions but no conservation easement.
- A survey and forest inventory has been done
- No management plan exists for the property.
- Concerns center on the Mill Pond, human impact and stewardship.
- The Town Forest is abutted by SPNH forest land

A. Blue Job Discussion

Concerns are still centered on lost hikers and erosion by four-wheelers and the fact that this is one of the town's most valuable natural resource. Dave suggested doing invites to the October meeting that include: DRED. NH F&G, and our local state forest ranger.
