June 16, 2008 Meeting Minutes

This properly posted meeting was held in the Selectmen's office at the Town Offices. Selectmen present: William McAuley and Betsy Hardwick Public present: Polly Freese and BJ Carbee

Meeting came to order at 7:00 PM with two Selectmen, Hardwick and McAuley, constituting a quorum.

Joy/Hoey escrow account was discussed. Town treasurer Ron Reimer did not have any information on this account, so it was decided that temporary Administrative Assistant Samantha Coughlin should call their attorney Silas Little to find out if he had any information on the issue.

Bonding for the Town was discussed and it was determined that the issue is taken care of by the Town insurance policy.

It was noted that no bids have been received for the two safes located in the basement of the Town Hall. The Selectmen have recently been informed that one of them might have belonged to the Oak Hill Grange and it was possible that one of their former members might have the combination to access it. It was understood that Grange member Dariel Peterson was checking on this.

There was some general discussion about the Transfer Station budget.

Transfer Station employees have relayed that they have been finding household trash left in the trash barrels at the Town Beach. After some general discussion about there being a 'carry in, carry out' policy in the past, it was decided that Town employees would be directed to remove the trash barrels and that once again it will be 'carry in, carry out'.

BJ Carbee and Polly Freese both expressed concern about the "unmarked" new cruiser and were assured by McAuley that the cruiser would be marked as soon as they could get it in the shop.

Discussed revisions to the Administrative Assistant job description and agreed the changes were acceptable.

Henry Kunhardt left a note for the Selectmen to the effect that the MS9 and MS10 Forms have been taken care of.

Signed the Check Manifest and one building permit.
