Board of Selectmen Meeting June 23, 2008 7:05 pm MINUTES

The meeting being properly posted, and McAuley, Anderson and Hardwick present comprising a quorum; McAuley calls the meeting to order at 7:05 pm.

Sam Bonacci, Sara Pyle, Barbara Jean Carbee and Ben Watson present in the audience.

Referred Christina Dubuque's non-profit report to the state regarding care, protection and placement of stray animals to Code Officer to determine if it is a kennel.

Referred to the AA the question of the cost of tax information on the website.

Anderson moved, McAuley second to allow the Conservation Commission to place a sign advertising the Joan Hanchett nature series walk at the Town forest in front of the town hall. Passed 2-0.

The Deering selectmen would like a meeting to discuss PSNH improvement of Class 6 roads under their power line and the impact it will have on affected towns.

Anderson will draft a letter to the Deering selectmen regarding perambulation of the town line.

McAuley will determine who is on the Highway Safety Committee.

Road Agent reports that approval for repairs on the multi-plate culvert on the 2nd NHTS might be forthcoming.

Carbee asks if FS&G is cheaper to use to haul gravel. Not necessarily, depending on type of material and where equipment is located. Carbee asks if Richard Foote is a full-time employee. No, seasonal as needed. Carbee asks what caused the oil leak on the Bennington Road. McAuley explains the effect of heavy trucks on a chip sealed road. Carbee asks when the sink hole adjacent to the rear door of the town offices will be repaired. McAuley will check with the Road Agent.

Board discussed the Chris Danforth letter regarding the Wiederhold project and the possible upgrade of the trail adjacent to the Harbage residence. Hardwick recommended we wait until the Planning Board completes its review and gets something from the Wiederholds in writing. Anderson moves to table, McAuley seconds. Passed 3-0

Hardwick moves to list Town Office Building with the NH State Register of Historic Places as part of the Main Street Heritage District in Francestown. McAuley seconds. Passed 3-0.

Anderson moves to adjourn. McAuley seconds. Passed 3-0. Meeting adjourns at 8:09 pm.
