## 3. Information Matters:

• Superintendent's Report: Mrs. Sabolinski stated that when they began merging the data bases into the new Aspen system, residency issues began popping up. With limited resources, she feels they owe it to the Town of Franklin to do a residency audit to 'weed out' those not legally residing in Franklin. The audit will take place in January. She also mentioned that the School Building Committee met last week. The proposed plan on the high school has been submitted to the MSBA for their approval, which is expected to take place at their January meeting – after which, we will ask the Town Council to hold a special election to fund the project. That election is expected to occur in March. Finally, Mrs. Sabolinski noted that on January 3, 2012, the Finance Committee and Town Council are invited to tour all of the schools. The tour begins at 7:30 a.m. at the High School.

- 4. New Business: Mrs. Mullen noted that she has sent the charges for the subcommittees to all the Committee members. She also noted that she will send out some new dates for the meeting with Glen Kutcher in hopes that all members can attend.
- 5. Open Meeting Law Training: Michelle McNulty reviewed for the members of the Committee the Open Meeting Laws. The law requires all meetings of a public body must be open to the public, unless a valid reason for executive session exists. She then reviewed for the Committee the purpose of executive session.
