• Payroll:

Mrs. Douglas reviewed the payroll, found it to be in order and recommended acceptance.

- FHS Student Representatives: Sarah and Susan discussed graduation and thanked the Committee for attending. Sarah will attend Northeastern University in the fall and will major in Civil Engineering. Susan will attend MIT in the fall and will major in Mechanical Engineering. She will minor in German.
- Correspondence: Mrs. Mullen acknowledged the letter from Mark Goguen and the letter from Whitsons.

2. Guests/Presentations:

- a. FHS Athletes: Mrs. Mullen and Mr. Light discussed the accomplishments of the boys' and girls' tennis, lacrosse and track teams as well as the baseball and softball teams. Certificates of Achievements were also handed out.
- b. ASMS Best Buddies Presentation: A video was shown to the Committee of the 8th graders from the ASMS lip synching to a song. Mrs. Whitcoff noted that 90% of the 8th graders participated in this video. Students who participated noted that this video will serve as a memory to them and think it should become a school tradition.
- c. RMS Science Student's Presentation: Three students participated in the Christopher Columbus Awards in which students use the scientific process to solve real world problems and change their community. These students tackled the issue of heavy backpacks. They submitted their finding to the organization and were one of the top 30 entries in the United States. Mr. Peri noted that they did an amazing job.
- d. Remington Middle School Update Mr. Peri discussed with the Committee some changes that occurred this year including a new Assistant Principal, five new teachers, etc. He also discussed the MCAS results. He noted they scored very high for ELA and high for Math. However, they are not meeting AYP in performance and improvement in subgroups for Math or performance in ELA. He also noted that next year's 7th and 8th grade class sizes will average 28.9 students. He discussed with the Committee iPeriod which is a time for individualized instruction, basic skills enrichment and test taking strategies. This occurs 3 days of the 6 day cycle. Next year he would like to work on the schools culture and climate, school safety, bullying prevention and cyber citizenship and cultural/racial awareness to name a few.

• Non-Budgeted Donations to FPS: Mrs. Goodman and Mrs. Sabolinski discussed with the Committee donations. PCC's, the Franklin Education Foundation, the

Boosters, Best Buddies, Harvard Law School IT Department, Private Donors, Local Businesses and other Organizations all donate funds that help support and enrich the educational program. They provide for supplies and materials, fieldtrips, enrichment activities, musical instruments and scholarships just to name a few. Over \$100,000 was donated this year. Mrs. Trahan thanked them for putting this information together. She noted that it is important for the Community to see what parents do.
