Refurbishing the Museum (80 West Central St.)

Debbie P. is attending weekly project meetings concerning the changes happening in the new Town Historical Museum. Work will begin within the week. New windows will take an estimated 10 weeks to arrive.

Debbie has been notified by people who are willing to help move inventory from 150 Emmons St. into the new space.

It is our understanding that staff and students at Tri-County School will be helping to refurbish the library section of the new museum during the upcoming academic year.

Keigan Chevrolet of Franklin is going out of business, and has office furniture that they will not need. Some items may be of use in work areas of the new museum.

Museum Inventory

Dianne and Del continue to make great progress in placing many hundreds of photographs in order.

Del reports that there are still 35 boxes full of items that need to be inventoried.

Walking Tour of Downtown Franklin

Bob had previously sent out a draft of a proposed walking tour of the Town to Commission members. At this meeting, Debbie and Del provided Bob with a large amount of very helpful information about the specific houses on the tour route and thir history.

Four Corners School

The Commssion has not yet found any pictures of students who attended the Four Corners School, as a possible addition to the historic plaque to be erected on that spot as part of the construction of the new Walgreen's store. Town Councillor Judith Pfeiffer once attended the former Four Corners School, and said she would see if she had any from her time there.

Use of The Former Horace Mann Museum

We discussed the possibility that the subject of the continued use of the former Museum on Washington St. would be coming before the Town Council. It will soon be time to decide how the building is to be used.
