# City Council Meeting November 2, 2015

### **Call to Order**

Mayor Merrifield called the meeting to order in the Council Chambers, Franklin City Hall at 6:00 p.m.

#### In Attendance

Councilor Dzujna, Councilor Starkweather, Councilor Desrochers, Councilor Feener, Councilor Wells, Councilor Barton, Councilor Clarenbach, Mayor Merrifield and City Manager Dragon.

Salute to the Flag was led by Councilor Wells.

## **Comments from the Public**

Director of Municipal Services Brian Sullivan advised that a structural engineer had been hired to work on the problem of motion with the stage. When the Opera House would put on a performance there would be motion on the stage. Some progress is being made on solving the problem and Director Sullivan advised they will once again meet with the engineer tomorrow.

Chief Goldstein commented on some of the concerns he has been following in Concord at the legislature. He stated that he is the chair of the legislative committee for the chiefs association and been particularly concerned recently about three bills. One bill has to with the drug forfeiture account. These funds are used in local communities to fund drug investigations and the state is proposing instead diverting those funds to the state general fund. Second there is a bill that would erode away at local official's immunity and this would impact every department. Third there is a bill to allow non police flaggers at the discretion of the governing board instead of requiring it be a safety decision

usually determined by the local police chief. The chief indicated at some point he may need to come back to the council and ask for support. Resident Leigh Webb thanked Director Sullivan, Mayor Merrifield and City Manager Dragon for your cooperation in helping to determine the problem with the stage in the opera and work quickly towards a solution.

## **Choose Franklin**

Mrs. Jo Brown, Co-Chair announced that First Day will be held during the first week of January, 2016. She also stated that this Thursday at 8am at the library Choose Franklin will be hosting downtown businesses and a speaker on economic development. In December, Choose Franklin will be hosting Non-profit organizations in the community.

Bristol Police Chief expressed appreciation to Officers Gotthardt, Officer Ciavola and Dispatcher Ballin for their assistance in the arrest of two wanted individuals without any harm to the officers. Their assistance is greatly appreciated by the Bristol Police Department.

#### National Guard Radio Tower Co-Location – Pleasant Street Tower

City Manager gave update. The National Guard is continuing to meet with department heads and Lakes Region dispatch. They do not plan to do construction until spring and so there is time to carefully consider the proposal.

Motion made Councilor Desrochers that the Franklin City Council schedules a public hearing for December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2015 at 6:05 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, regarding authorizing the withdrawal of no more than eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000) from the Raymond and Betty Turcotte Rescue Trust Fund to be used as contribution in funding the construction of a Rescue Trailer Storage Barn located at the Fire Station. Motion seconded by Councilor Dzujna; all in favor; motion to schedule public hearing passes.

## **City Manager's Update**

Manager Dragon advised that the City received the following contingent grant line amount: \$300 Book Club; \$2,947.82 State of NH Fire Training; and \$1,986.14 Crimeline for K9 Officer.

Manager Dragon provided an update regarding the work happening at the Macosko Foundry. Director Lewis has been working with various agencies to deal with Brownsfield issues at the foundry. She provided a copy of the most recent update from the US Environmental Protection Agency. EPA is spending about \$150,000 on this clean up which certainly saves the city money and the time/effort to submit and wait for an EPA clean up grant.

Manager Dragon met with Senator Hosmer concerning three bills. 1. A follow-up to the public statement made by the City Council regarding the Curfew Ordinance.

2. An LSR to allow the expenditure of WRBP funds for studies related to the evaluation of the most cost effective operation of the system. 3. With regard to WRBP, an LSR to make amendments to the role of the Advisory Board.

## **Zoning Board Appointments**

Councilor Feener moved and Councilor Dzjuna seconded the motion to appoint Ms. Debbie Davis as an alternate on the Zoning Board; term of service to 2018. All were in favor and the motion passed.
