Street Drugs & Trends – This is an all-day workshop provided by NHTIAD. Training takes place in Concord. These are very reputable trainings, and through our DFC Grant, we have funds for Task Force Member development. Interested members were directed to sign up via the Task Force Coordinator.

Guest Speaker *Spotlight on Local Resources*

Phoenix House Franklin Center staff Peter DalPra and Amanda Snyder gave a very informational presentation about the treatment and services that the Franklin Center provides, and also presented an overview of addiction.

Important points from this presentation include:

- Phoenix House has programs in all 6 New England states.
- Phoenix House Franklin Center is currently an 11-bed facility that offers Detox services, a 28-day rehabilitation program and transitional living for individuals recovering from their addiction(s).
- All questions about services offered and addiction resources can be made to: 1-800-DRUG-HELP
- Treatment options for adolescents: Very limited in our state! There are only 6 state-funded beds for adolescents in NH (located in Dublin, NH).
- Webster Place, which is right across the street from Phoenix House, is not a treatment facility but rather a recovery center.
- The earlier a person starts abusing a substance, the easier it is to become addicted! This is where youth prevention and parent education come into play.
