Quick Update on our work regarding:

*Parent Education: Planning for the Parent Education series is going really well. Traci and Rob Groleau are working regularly on this and are hoping for a good turnout. Currently, we are working on getting the program advertised through local papers and through sending out information via the High School and Middle School. Traci is updating the "Parenting Makes the Difference" brochure, which we plan to use as a way to spread the word about both the importance of parenting, AND the two parenting classes being offered this fall in Franklin. Copies of the brochure will be handed out to the Task Force once it is finalized and approved by the Parent Involvement Committee.

*School Alcohol and Drug Policies: Dr. Ward agreed to watch the Student Drug Testing video, and said that she watched a good portion of it. Traci met with Dr. Ward and Principal Towne and had a good conversation about the Task Force's intentions in helping to improve ATOD Policies at the High School. Dr. Ward and Principal Towne agreed that the ATOD policies need to be improved and are very open to receiving copies of the state's ATOD School Policy template, once it is finalized. However, they do not feel that pursuing student drug testing is a good strategy at this time. Enforcement of the regular ATOD policies are an issue and they recognize that introducing something such as school drug testing needs to be done in small steps. A good first step will be updating the current ATOD policies. Dr. Ward said that this will be up to the School Board Policy Committee. We should get them a copy of the template policy once we have it.

Jason has received a copy of the DRAFT state ATOD school policy and we handed out copies to interested Task Force Members. We are awaiting a FINAL version..

HOWEVER, on a good 'making progress' note, we did discuss the plan to have the Task Force give a quick update about the Parenting Classes (trying to recruit) at the High School Open House, and Dr. Ward and Principal Towne also approved the idea of having the Task Force hand out home drug testing kits and resource packets for parents. This will be a good way to start getting parents used to the idea of drug testing **SO,** Traci, Lynn and Jason spent time planning for the Open House and making home drug testing resource packets. The High School Open House is tonight (starting at 6pm), so Traci, Lynn and Jason are leaving the Task Force meeting at 5:30. Wish them luck! The group is anxious to hear how it goes.

In addition, Traci will be facilitating a parent information session called "Marijuana and the Developing Brain" after the Middle School Open House. We will have samples of the home drug testing kits for parents to see, and some resource packets for parents to take if they want.
