





Trends in Use and Emerging Substances of Concern


Percentage of High School Students who Reported Past 30-Day Use of Alcohol

Percentage of High School Students who Reported Past 30-Day Use of Prescription Drugs




K2 and Spice Use

In 2013, **19.1% of Franklin high school** students reported having ever used **synthetic marijuana** compared to 14.1% of high school youth in the state of NH.
