Security Cameras- Traci Fowler spoke to the idea that the Mayor's Drug Task Force was hoping to be able to support this project but the DFC grant won't allow funds to be spend for police equipment. Thus, Traci is hoping they may be able to donate some funds to OPCP for Daniell Park renovations and also dedicate some money to help publicize and support marketing/promotion of the parks.

Basketball at Daniell- We need to obtain a new quote for paving of the court. Krystal to follow up.

Stone Park- We are on the top of the stack for the NH Charitable Foundation for 2012. We asked for \$20,000 this year and they want us to reapply for next year.
