Subject: City Council to consider scheduling a Public Hearing on Resolution #04-13, a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$64,019 to establish and run an afterschool program for student's ages 5-13 years old. Councilor moves: "I move the Franklin City Council adopts Ordinance #04-13 to add the after school program fee of \$25 per week to Chapter 160, Fees, 160-1 Fees charged for services by the City of Franklin by a roll call vote.

#### Discussion:

For several years the school offered an after school program through Casey Family Services for the middle school and elementary school. Casey Family Services has decided to eliminate the after school and summer programs in the City of Franklin. The after school program accepted about 70 children at the elementary level and 70 at the middle school level. With the closing of Casey, the City of Franklin no longer has any afterschool care for families with the exception of a couple small in home daycares.

During the budget discussions I believe the school stated they would be offering an afterschool program. However, based on a conversation that I had with Dr. Ward, she stated that the afterschool program factored into the schools budget will be an academic based program. It will be an extension to the school day of 1.5 hours for SELECTED students in need – based on who the teachers feel need the extra academic help. Therefore, there is still a need for an afterschool program in this community for those families that do not have students in need of extra academic help.

Currently I am receiving calls daily from residents asking what there is for their children to do afterschool. Therefore, I have run some budgetary numbers and believe I can offer an afterschool program through the Recreation Department for 60 students that will be offset by revenues. Without having the costs associated with busses, field trips, etc. the main expenses of an afterschool program is staff, snack and limited supplies. I have been able to find a program through the Department of Education that will fund an afterschool snack and I anticipate offsetting the remainder of expenses through user fees.

The afterschool program would be based out of the current Recreation center until we move to Rowell. It would start at 2:30pm when the Elementary School gets out and run until 6:00pm. The program will accept children ages 5-13 years old. Students will have an opportunity to do their homework, have a snack, engage in physical activity, arts & crafts and other activities on a daily basis. The program will cost \$25.00 per week, per child. I am working with the Department of Health and Human Services so that I can bill the state for child care if the families are eligible, which I currently do for my summer program. I will maintain the 10 children to 1 staff member ratio with an Event Supervisor to oversee the daily operations.

Ordinance #04-13 would need to be adopted should the City Council adopt Resolution #04-13 allowing the recreation department to offer an afterschool program. The ordinance adds the weekly fee to the Municipal Code.

Fiscal Impact: See attached budget

Alternatives: Currently, there are not other options for child care after the school day in the City of Franklin. Therefore, this may become a problem for some families to stay employed if they need to care for their children afterschool or many children will go home to fend for themselves at an extremely young age so their parents can work to support their family.
