Boys & Girls club of Franklin: In March I had reported to the City Council challenges that we have encountered while attempting to better coordinate programs between the Boys & Girls club and the City's after school and summer programming. At a meeting on March 28th with Chris Emonds (Boys & Girls club director), Bob Carter (site director Concord) and Tom Charbono (site director Franklin) and Krystal Alpers-I stressed the importance of better communication between the two organizations. Instead of reading about their program changes in the Three Rivers Newsletter- if we had direct communication between organizations about program changes/offerings it would allow each organization to adjust programming & staffing when necessary. It seemed that everyone left the meeting in agreement. However, sadly this has not occurred.

This month we heard from School board members & Councilor Dzujna that the Boys and Girls club presented a MOU to run their programs at the Paul Smith School at no charge to the club. Luckily, the school board requested additional follow up information before making any decisions. Including, a meeting between the City Recreation dept and Boys and Girls club to make sure there is coordination between programming. This issue was also discussed by the City's recreation committee on June 17<sup>th</sup>. At this point we have not been contacted by the Boys & Girls club and there has been no collaboration. This is concerning if we are to begin working together for a joint grant application for after school programming (21<sup>st</sup> century grant).

In preparation for our meeting back in March-Director Alpers had met with representatives from the school to create a list of what the Park & Recreation Department provides, what the school provides, and what the boys & girls club was providing. She also asked for input from the schools in regards to needs that they felt weren't currently being met. One of the big needs identified was a teen center. Clearly creating a teen center is a challenge for any of the organizations to provide on their own... but together and with the potential of help from future 21<sup>st</sup> century grant funds it could be possible.

I still feel that creating a program to just create a program does not make sense. Creating value added is what we need to strive to achieve. When organizations and programs can coordinate the scarce available dollars are better utilized. I feel the Boys & Girls club think that there is capacity to run both programs independently. I disagree. I have also had concerns about

the sustainability of the Boys & Girls program here in Franklin. They have stated it will be crucial for Tom Charbono to fundraise about \$25,000 each year. To me that is worrisome. Casey Family Services were only able to provide afterschool programming while they received the 21<sup>st</sup> century grant (5yr grant). Once they no longer received those grant funds the city stepped up to the plate to create an afterschool program that is low cost and self funded. The Boys & Girls program has a great deal to offer. I feel if we could find a way to synchronize programming in a way that works for everyone we could accomplish so much more together. I am very grateful to the school board for recognizing this potential and requesting coordination between programs.
