PROCLAMATION

In the Year of our Lord, Two Thousand Sixteen,

A Proclamation relating to Arbor Day in Franklin, New Hampshire, in keeping with our City's continuing efforts towards recognizing the importance of trees; their upkeep; maintenance, replacement, removal and their surrounding habitat.

WHEREAS, The City of Franklin, New Hampshire typically tends to celebrate Arbor Day in the Fall Season, thereby avoiding the heat of the summer and recognizing that Fall is the most suitable time of the year to plant trees, and

WHEREAS, In 1872 a gentleman named J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees, and

WHEREAS, The concept of dedicating a day called Arbor Day was first observed in the State of Nebraska with the planting of more than one million trees throughout this State over the year of 1872, and

WHEREAS, Trees should be planted in their appropriate Natural Environment as many species are only adaptable to certain climate zones, soils, sunlight, precipitation, air quality and other conditions most suitable to their origin throughout the world, and

WHEREAS, in order for trees to be healthy they should be planted allowing for no conflicts with underground or overhead utilities, space to develop a canopy and mature to their natural shape and beauty through proper pruning and maintenance to avoid potential safety hazards.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, I Kenneth Merrifield, Mayor of the City of Franklin, New Hampshire, a City with more Trees than People, do hereby proclaim Thursday, November 3, 2016 as:

"ARBOR DAY in FRANKLIN, NEW HAMPSHIRE"

and invite all Citizens to participate in the preparation and the planting of four trees in <u>Daniell Park</u> located off of Liberty Avenue, beginning at 11 A.M.
