Jack Moultrie presented Article #2 and discussed with the FinCom. Jack handed out a packet of information to the board regarding the bridge.

Ray Bateman presented Article #9 and discussed with the FinCom.

Motion to take under advisement Article #9 with changes stating \$125,000 from the water department's retained earnings. Lisa moved

Some discussion arose from the last meeting. The School Building project has no dollar value as of yet. It was rumored to be \$30 million; this is not a real number. They have no idea where that number came from.

School choice money was explained by Steve Fortado, school business manager. We have about 30 students that leave our town for school choice and we have about 67 that come in.

Cost of gas and oil were discussed. The school department increased their previously budgeted amounts by 30% for gas and 20% for oil. All departments were requested to increase their budgets for oil and gas by 20%.

The stabilization fund has \$1.1 million in it and free cash is \$448,763. It is recommended not to touch stabilization. We do not want to jeopardize our bond rating.

Motion to take no action on Article #8 Mike moved Phil 2nd Vote 6-0 in favor, 1 abstained

Motion to recommend Article #9, for \$125,000 from the water departments retained earnings Mike moved Walter 2nd Vote 6-0 in favor, 1 abstained

Motion made to appoint Phil Cannon as the Finance Committee representative on the School Building Committee. Ruth moved Mike 2nd Vote 6-0 in favor, 1 abstained

Free cash if all articles are passed at town meeting and come from free cash then the balance left will be about \$56,000.
