Meeting called to Order at 7:01 PM by Sandy Gerraughty

Budget Presentations:

- ◆ Fire Department: They explained their local, state and federal mandates. The Fire Department is asking for paid personnel during the week to man the station. There are 3 options that were presented. Option A is a 40 hour a week chief. Option B is a 30 hour a week chief and 2 full time EMT's. Option C is a 30 hour a week chief and per-diem EMT's for 8 hour days. Option C is their preference. The response time is calculated from the time the 911 call was placed to the time a truck gets to the location. The average time was 9 minutes. From 6:00 am to 11:00 am, 44% of the calls were greater than 16 minutes response time and 25% were 15 minutes. The main factor for this is that the volunteers are either at work or on their way home from work, thereby there are very few people in town available to respond. The Fire department feels they are taking full advantage of grant money that is available, but would welcome help writing the grants. The Fire department was asked if they have any statistics that they would like included in the Finance and Advisory Board's annual report.
- Police Department: They explained their local, state and federal mandates. Their needs based budget is up from FY08 due primarily to salary obligations, vehicle maintenance and gas, and cruiser replacement. Sergeant Cudmore has a program on his computer that he uses to track all vehicles maintenance. Due to this, he is able to maintain the vehicles better and they last longer. Sandy asked if he were willing to share this with other town departments to use and he said, absolutely. The Police Department was asked if they have any statistics that they would like included in the Finance and Advisory Board's annual report.
