School House Estimates

The fence around the Veteran's Memorial in Byfield is in need of repair and broken rails may be able to be paid for with GHC budget money. Phil to ask Peter who the vendor was that completed the project initially. It was noted that the flag pole was broken and the flag was below half-mast. Members were unsuccessful in attempting to repair. Brian arranged for it to be fixed at no charge.

Union Cemetery

Historical House Survey

The Town has approved of the agreement with K. Grover Historic Associates to complete the survey. The contract has been signed. Work to begin in December.

Project completion is pending; Stone and flag installation being overseen by Gary Fowler.

Congregational Church Grant for Doors

The contract between the Board of Selectmen and the Congregational Church has been finalized with a preservation restriction.

New Business

Flagpole stains at Harry Murch Park is apparently from the watering system. Phil will ask Peter if he or Jim DiMento would be responsible.

Restoration of the George Peabody portrait for the Library (CPA funds) is almost complete and should return the first of the year.

81 Elm St. Property – Gloria queried whether or not the Commission could be proactive in requesting the owner (bank) to maintain the historical property. It was a foreclosure and there has not been any noticeable activity for 2 years. It was suggested to ask Ed if he had any documentation regarding the history of the house.
