Raffle tickets, but also we talked to many prospective members and volunteers about our Center. The plans for our new 1,300 sq.ft. building addition are progressing. In September, the Scotia-Glenville Senior Citizens Board of Directors approved the acceptance of the proposal from Synthesis architects, the firm chosen by the expansion committee as the lowest bidder to design, cost-engineer and prepare construction documents for the addition. The Town Board then voted to enter into an agreement with Synthesis for their architectural service. Hopefully construction will begin in 2015.
