# ProposedWHEREAS, there is a university residential campus in the Town ofOrder #7902Gorham; and,

**WHEREAS,** fraternity and sorority housing is often located off-campus and near universities; and,

**WHEREAS,** there have been several residential properties housing fraternities and sororities in Gorham; and,

WHEREAS, fraternity and sorority houses have frequently been the attraction and location for behavior that has been disruptive of the neighborhood they are located in and required numerous responses by

the Police Department; and,

**WHEREAS,** there have been serious violations of the Life Safety Code that threatened the health, welfare and lives of the residents of these properties; and,

WHEREAS, these properties are often the source of behavior that disturbs and disrupts the peaceful enjoyment of the immediate and nearby neighborhoods,

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED,** that the Town Council of the Town of Gorham, Maine, in Town Council assembled approve an amendment to the Land Use and Development Code, Chapter I, Sections V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X and XIII by adding a definition of "Fraternity House" and by eliminating "Fraternity House" as a permitted use or as a use by special exception as proposed.

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO GORHAM LAND USE CODE CHAPTER 1:

**ZONING REGULATIONS** (NOTE: Proposed additions to the Code are <u>underlined</u>; proposed deletions are <del>struck through</del>.)

#### SECTION V – DEFINITIONS

<u>Forested wetland</u> A freshwater wetland dominated by woody vegetation that is six (6) meters tall or taller.

Fraternity House Any building or structure, and the use thereof, traditionally affiliated with a college or university, regardless of whether any such affiliation is currently recognized formally or not, providing common living, dining, kitchen, study and/or sleeping areas for college or university students as members of the fraternity, and their guests. The term shall be deemed to include similarly defined sorority houses, but shall not be deemed to include fraternal organizations, such as the Masons or the Elks.

#### SECTION VI – URBAN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT

#### B. <u>PERMITTED USES</u>

9) Rooming house, apartment building or multifamily housing, <u>except fraternity housing</u>.
12) School, hospital, church, or any other institution of educational, religious, philanthropic, fraternal, or social nature which is not used for residential purposes, which has less than two thousand (2,000) square feet of floor area and generates less than two hundred (200) vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period, <u>except fraternity houses</u>.

#### C.SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS

3) School, hospital, church or any other institution of education, religious, philanthropic, fraternal or social nature which is not used for residential purposes and has two thousand (2,000) or more square feet of floor area or generates two hundred (200) or more vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period.

#### SECTION VII – SUBURBAN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT

#### B. PERMITTED USES

10) School, hospital, church, or any other nonresidential institution of educational, religious, philanthropic, fraternal, or social nature which has less than two thousand (2,000) square feet of floor area and generates less than two hundred (200) vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period, except fraternity housing.

#### C. SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS

5) School, hospital, church or any other nonresidential institution of education, religious, philanthropic, <del>fraternal</del> or social nature and has two thousand (2,000) or more square feet of floor area or generate two hundred (200) or more vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period.

# SECTION VIII – RURAL DISTRICT

B.PERMITTED USES

10) Apartment buildings or multifamily housing, except fraternity housing.

12) School, hospital, church, or any other institution of educational, religious, philanthropic, fraternal, or social nature which is not used for residential purposes, which has less than two thousand (2,000) square feet of floor area and generates less than two hundred (200) vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period.

#### C. SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS

4) School, hospital, church or any other institution of education, religious, philanthropic, fraternal or social nature which has two thousand (2,000) or more square feet of floor area or generates two hundred (200) or more vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period.

#### SECTION IX - VILLAGE CENTERS DISTRICT

## SUBSECTION 1. LITTLE FALLS VILLAGE CENTER DISTRICT

#### B.PERMITTED USES

4) Residential uses including one-family dwellings, two-family dwellings, apartment buildings and multi-family housing but excluding mobile homes and trailers, <u>except fraternity housing</u>.
11) School, hospital, church, or any other institution of educational, religious, philanthropic, fraternal, or social nature which is not used for residential purposes, which has less than two thousand (2,000) square feet of floor area and which generates less than two hundred (200) vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period.

#### C.SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS

2) School, hospital, church or any other institution of education, religious, philanthropic, fraternal or social nature which is not used for residential occupancy and has two thousand (2,000) or more square feet of floor area or generates two hundred (200) or more vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period.

#### SUBSECTION 2. GORHAM VILLAGE CENTER DISTRICT

#### B.PERMITTED USES

4) Residential uses including one-family dwellings, two-family dwellings, apartment buildings and multi-family housing but excluding mobile homes, and trailers, and fraternity housing.
11) School, hospital, church, or any other institution of educational, religious, philanthropic, fraternal, or social nature which is not used for residential purposes, which has less than two thousand (2,000) square feet of floor area and which generates less than two hundred (200) vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period.

#### C.SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS

2) School, hospital, church or any other institution of education, religious, philanthropic, fraternal or social nature which is not used for residential occupancy and has two thousand (2,000) or more square feet of floor area or generates two hundred (200) or more vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period.

#### SECTION X - URBAN COMMERCIAL DISTRICT

#### B.PERMITTED USES

5) Rooming house, excluding fraternity housing.

8) School, hospital, church, or any other institution of educational, religious, philanthropic, fraternal, or social nature which is not used for residential occupancy which has less than two thousand (2,000) square feet of floor area and which generates less than two hundred (200) vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period.

#### C.SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS

2) hool, hospital, church or any other institution of education, religious, philanthropic, fraternal or social nature which is not used for residential occupancy which has two thousand (2,000) or more square feet of floor area or which generates two hundred (200) or more vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period.

#### SECTION XIII – COMMERCIAL/OFFICE DISTRICT

#### B.PERMITTED USES

8) Rooming house, excluding fraternity housing.

11) School, hospital, church, or any other institution of educational, religious, philanthropic, fraternal, or social nature which is not used for residential purposes, which has less than two thousand (2,000) square feet of floor area and generates less than two hundred (200) vehicles

trips during any twenty-four hour period.

C. SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS

2) School, hospital, church or any other institution of educational, religious, philanthropic, fraternal or social nature which is not used for residential occupancy which has two thousand (2,000) or more square feet of floor area or which generates two hundred (200) or more vehicle trips during any twenty-four hour period.

Applicability date notwithstanding the provisions of 1 MRSA, Section 302 or any other law to the contrary, this ordinance, when enacted, shall govern any building permit application that has not received all required approvals prior to July  $6^{th}$ , 2010.

**Item #7903** Action on a proposed ordinance to regulate fraternities.

ProposedWHEREAS, there are several fraternity houses located within the TownOrder #7903of Gorham; and,

WHEREAS, these fraternity houses have been a persistent source of Police summonses, a source of serious violations of the Life Safety Code that threatens the health, welfare, and lives of the residents of the houses and has been a source of behavior that disturbs the peace and quite of the neighborhood,

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED,** that the Town Council of the Town of Gorham, Maine, in Town Council assembled adopt the Ordinance to Regulate Fraternity and Sorority Houses as proposed.

#### Proposed Ordinance to Regulate Fraternity and Sorority Houses.

#### Section 1. Purpose

1.1 The purpose of this ordinance is to ensure the safe operation of fraternity and sorority houses, as defined below, for residents who are living in these facilities and to ensure that fraternities and sororities are good neighbors within the immediate areas in which they are located.

#### Section 2. Authority

2.1 This ordinance is enacted pursuant to Title 30-A M.R.S.A., Section 3001. Section 3. Severability Clause

3.1 If any part of this Ordinance is held to be invalid, such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

#### Section 4. Definitions

4.1 Fraternity or Fraternity House: Any building or structure, and the use thereof, traditionally affiliated with a college or university, regardless of whether any such affiliation is currently recognized formally or not, providing common living, dining, kitchen, study and/or sleeping areas for college or university students as members of the fraternity and their guests. The term shall be deemed to include similarly defined sorority houses, but shall not be deemed to include fraternal organizations, such as the Masons or the Elks.

4.2 License Year: Shall be the period of time from August 1 to July 31 of the following year.

4.3 Mass Gathering: For purposes of this ordinance, a Mass Gathering at a Fraternity House shall be any event when 15 or more non-resident guests are reasonably expected to attend at the Fraternity House.

#### Section 5. Annual License and Fee Required

5.1 Each Fraternity House shall be required to obtain an annual license from the

Town by August 1. Said license will be good for the license year that runs from August 1 to July 31, unless revoked pursuant to section 5.4.

5.2 In order to obtain a license, a Fraternity House:

Must have successfully passed its most recent Life Safety Code Fire Inspection conducted by the Town of Gorham's Fire Inspector.

Must have all of the property taxes on the facility fully paid.

Must pay the annual license fee.

May not have recorded more than 10 responses by the Gorham Police Department in the preceding license year.

5.3 The annual license fee shall be established by the Town Council and may be periodically adjusted by Town Council vote.

5.4 The Town of Gorham may revoke an annual license for a Fraternity House when during the course of its license year, the facility:

a. Complies 2 or more violations of this ordinance, or

b. Records more than 10 responses by the Gorham Police Department, or

c. Fails its most recent Life Safety Code inspection by the Town and has failed to bring the Fraternity House into compliance within a reasonable period of time, as solely determined by the Gorham Fire Department.

#### Section 6. Life Safety Code Inspections

6.1 The Fire Department shall conduct regular semi-annual inspections of Fraternity Houses to ensure continued compliance with all applicable Life Safety Codes. When violations are found pursuant to an inspection, and after written notice thereof and an order to correct any such violations have been given to the appropriate representative of the fraternity house, the Fire Department may conduct as many additional inspections as needed to ensure compliance. The Town Council shall by Council Order set a fee for the regular inspections and for follow up inspections which fee may be changed periodically by Town Council vote.

#### Section 7. Mass Gatherings

7.1 At any event held at a Fraternity House, when 15 or more non resident guests are reasonably expected to attend, the Officers of the Fraternity House shall notify the Gorham Police Department and Fire Department, in advance, of the time and place of the event, and the number of guests that are expected to be attending.

7.2 The Fire Department shall inspect the facility where the function is to be held and will determine the allowed occupant load for the function.

7.3 At any mass gathering event held at the Fraternity House, when alcohol is being served or allowed to be consumed, the Officers of the Fraternity shall require all guests to sign-in. The sign-in list shall contain the printed name, signature and a method of contact for each guest. This list shall be available for immediate inspection, at any time, by the Gorham Police Department.

7.4 The Officers of the Fraternity shall designate one of the Officers of the Fraternity as the event supervisor who shall be in the facility at all times during the event and available to meet with any Police Officer or Emergency Response personnel, responding to a call.

#### Section 8. Violations and Penalties

8.1 Except as otherwise provided by law, anyone found to be in violation of any provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) nor more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense to be recovered for use by the Town and shall be subject to such other legal and equitable remedies as may be available to the Town including, without limitation, an award of attorney's fees pursuant to 30-A MRSA, Section 4452. Each day any such violation continues, shall constitute a separate offense.

**Proposed** WHEREAS, the Town of Gorham has experienced significant residential growth in areas of the community that were previously rural with limited housing over the past 30 years; and,

**WHEREAS,** the Town has a Firearms Ordinance with a Shotgun Only Zone that restricts the discharge of firearms to shotguns only within the zone intended to provide an additional measure of safety; and,

**WHEREAS**, continued residential growth has made it necessary to expand the Shotgun Only Zone,

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED,** that the Town Council of the Town of Gorham, Maine, in Town Council assembled amend the Firearms Ordinance and map to expand the Shotgun Only Zone, as proposed; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that notwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, this Ordinance shall be effective October 5, 2010.

**Proposed Amendment to the Firearms Ordinance** (NOTE: Proposed additions to the Code are <u>underlined</u>; proposed deletions are <u>struck through</u>.)

SECTION 2. SHOTGUN ONLY ZONE It shall be a violation of this ordinance for any person to discharge a firearm of any kind or description except for shotguns, within the "Shotgun Only Zone" as shown on the Gorham Firearms Map, which is dated June 7, 1994 October 5, 2010 as is kept in the Gorham Town Clerk's office.
