Now Therefore Be It Ordered, that the Town Council amend Chapter I, Section IV (B) of the Land

Use and Development Code as follows:

<u>CHAPTER I: ZONING REGULATIONS</u> <u>SECTION IV - BOARD OF APPEALS</u>

B. POWERS AND DUTIES

Appeals shall lie from the decision of the Code Enforcement Officer to the Board of Appeals and from the Board of Appeals to the Superior Court as provided by law.

The Board of Appeals shall have the following powers and duties:

- 1) Administrative Appeals. To hear and decide where it is alleged there is an error in any order, requirement, decision, or determination made by the Code Enforcement Officer in the enforcement of this Code, **except:**
 - A. Notices of violation, requirements, decisions, or determinations concerning any provision of or approval under, Chapter I, Section IV, E. Special Exception Standards, Chapter III (Subdivisions), or Chapter IV (Site Plan Review) of this Code, shall not be appealable to the Board of Appeals.
 - B. Decisions or determinations by the Code Enforcement Officer not to undertake an enforcement action shall not be appealable to the Board of Appeals.

<u>In any appeal allowed under this subsection</u>, <u>T</u>the action of the Code Enforcement Officer may be modified or reversed by the Board of Appeals, by majority vote.

Also, to hear and decide where it is alleged there is an error in any order, requirement, decision or determination made by the Planning Board or Code Enforcement Officer pursuant to Chapter II, Section I.E. Such action of the Planning Board or Code Enforcement Officer may be modified or reversed by the Board of Appeals by majority vote.
