budget for the Town, School, and Cumberland County.

Item # 9080 Action to consider the proposed budget for the Gorham School Department for

the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year. (Admin. Spon.)

Proposed

Order # 9080 Ordered, that the Town Council vote to approve the School Budget for the fiscal

year 2016-2017 as follows:

NOTE: Pursuant to Section 405 of the Council-Manager Charter of Town of Gorham, "The Town Council, after reviewing the proposed budget, may change the total appropriation prior to approving the final budget." Pursuant to State law, 20-A M.R.S.A. Section 2307, "In charter municipalities where the municipal charter confers upon a municipal council or other municipal legislative body the authority to determine the total amount of the school budget and confers upon the school committee or school board the authority to direct the expenditure of those funds for school purposes, the municipal council or other municipal legislative body shall determine the total amount of the school budget to be submitted to a budget validation referendum and the school committee or school board shall

determine the allocation of the approved school budget among the cost centers of the cost center summary budget format." Pursuant to section 15671-A(5 of Title 20-A of the Maine Revised Statues, when the Council approves a school budget exceeding the State's EPS funding model, a separate recorded council vote is required to approve the funds raised. Consequently, a separate Order follows this Order for that purpose.

ORDERED, that the following school budget items be adopted and approved for fiscal year 2016-2017:

That \$15,468,255 be authorized to be expended for Regular Instruction;

that \$5,404,755 be authorized to be expended for Special Education;

that \$402,335 be authorized to be expended for Career and Technical Education;

that \$819,806 be authorized to be expended for Other Instruction;

that \$2,712,794 be authorized to be expended for Student and Staff Support;

that \$1,087,606 be authorized to be expended for System Administration;

that \$1,862,917 be authorized to be expended for School Administration;

that \$1,694,518 be authorized to be expended for Transportation and Buses;

that \$3,905,278 be authorized to be expended for Facilities Maintenance;

that \$2,887,593 be authorized to be expended for Debt Service and Other Commitments; and that \$0 be authorized to be expended for All Other Expenditures.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED:

- 1. That \$36,245,857 appropriated for the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act and that \$11,891,410 be raised as the municipality's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15688. Explanation: The municipality's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act is the amount of money determined by state law to be the minimum amount that a municipality must raise in order to receive the full amount of state dollars.
- 2. That \$630,680 be raised and appropriated for the annual payments on debt service previously approved by the municipality's legislative body for non-state-funded school construction projects, non-state-funded portions of school construction projects in addition to the funds appropriated as the local share of the municipality's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12. Explanation: Non-state-funded debt service is the amount of money needed for the annual payments on the municipality's long-term debt for major capital school construction projects that are not approved for state subsidy. The bonding of this long-term debt was previously approved by the voters or other legislative body.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the school committee be authorized to expend \$36,245,857 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016 and ending June 30, 2017 from the municipality's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act, non-state-funded school construction projects, additional local funds for school purposes under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15690, unexpended balances, tuition receipts, state subsidy and other receipts for the support of schools.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the Town will appropriate \$245,321 for adult education and raise \$142,321 as the local share; with authorization to expend any additional, incidental, or miscellaneous receipts in the interest and for the well-being of the adult education program.

ORDERED that \$4,828,978 be raised and appropriated in additional local funds, which exceeds the State's Essential Programs and Services allocation model by \$4,176,258.91 as required to fund the budget recommended by the School Committee.

The School Committee recommends \$4,828,978 for additional local funds and gives the following reasons for exceeding the State's Essential Programs and Services funding model by \$4,176,258.91. The State's funding model does not support all of the costs of the schools because it includes only those costs considered essential by the new State Essential Programs and Services (EPS) model.

Explanation: - The additional local funds are those locally raised funds over and above the municipality's local

as described in the Essential Programs and Services funding Act and local amounts raised for the annual payment on non-state funded debt service that will help achieve the School Department budget for educational programs.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Education budget as finally approved by the Gorham Town Council and subsequently approved by the voters of the Town of Gorham be incorporated into a final Municipal budget; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Town Council vote to adopt the Capital Budget Part II in the amount of \$1,344,000 to be funded from the town's undesignated fund balance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that all taxes on real estate and personal property shall be due and payable upon approval of this Order and that one-half of all real estate and personal property taxes that remain unpaid on November 15, 2016 shall commence bearing interest on November 16, 2016, and that the final half of all real estate and personal property taxes that remain unpaid on May 15, 2017, shall commence bearing interest on May 16, 2017 at the interest rate of 7.0% per annum as authorized by Maine Law until paid and collected and the Tax Collector and Treasurer are authorized to collect and receive thereof; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Gorham Town Council authorizes the Finance Director to accept prepayment of real and personal property taxes; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to Title 36, M.R.S.A., Section 506A, the Gorham Town Council establishes an interest rate of 3.0% per annum to be paid on all real estate and personal property taxes rebated due to overpayment of taxes; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to Title 36, M.R.S.A., Section 906, the Gorham Town Council hereby require and direct that any tax payment received from an individual as payment for any property tax be applied against outstanding or delinquent taxes due on that property in chronological order beginning with the oldest unpaid tax bill, provided, however, that no such payment shall be applied to any tax for which an abatement application or appeal is pending unless approved in writing by the taxpayer. This order shall remain in effect until rescinded by the Municipal Officers.

Public hearing on a proposal to amend Chapter VII, Impact fees, of the Land Use Development Code to allow impact fees to be used within a reasonable period of time. (Admin. Spon.)

Proposed Order # 9082

Whereas, the Town has a Land Use and Development Code and several impact fees to address impacts that result from growth in the community, and Whereas the improvements indicated in the development plan are made over a reasonable period of time, as funds are collected and improvements are needed, and

Whereas, the ordinance currently requires impact fees to be returned after 10 years, regardless of a sufficient amount of funds have been collected to make the improvements, and

Whereas, as long as the improvements are still needed and in the communities best interest, returning funds because of an artificial 10 year deadline is not consistent with the original intent of the impact fee or in the best interest of the community,

Now Therefor be it Ordered that the Town Council adopt the following amendment to Chapter VII, Section 1 (F) (2) of the Land Use and Development Code:

Chapter VII Impact Fees Section I General F. Refunds of Impact Fees

(2) Any fees collected that are not spent or obligated by contract for the specified improvement within a reasonable time period for the specific impact fee account by the end of the calendar quarter immediately following ten (10) years from the date the fee was paid shall be returned to the developer or its designee without interest.
