## Chairman's Report

- Bob suggested we meet with someone from USM about working together –
   USM's biggest need is to get rid of food waste, they also need space for windrowing and composting on a large scale

- Bob suggested we somehow survey the businesses in town and find out what

  - Alison handed out flyers with explanation of what can be recycled and what cannot
  - o Alison had examples of plastics that are able to be recycled
  - o Alison stated that it is possible for us to work with her and create a "personalized" brochure for us to handout to the Gorham residents
  - o Bob suggested we find out if it is possible to have the brochures "stuffed" with the trash bags we buy
  - o Bob stated that there are places that will buy things that cannot be recycled and the use the item and turn it into a product; for example the company paid the school \$0.01 for each juice box and then turned the juice boxes into a backpack. The school made money and then the company could see the backpack and make money.
  - o Alison said this company is called TerraCycle.
