1. CALL TO ORDER.

Chairman, Sean Stanton, called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

3. SELECTBOARD'S ANNOUNCEMENTS/STATEMENTS:

A. GENERAL COMMENTS BY THE BOARD

Ed Abrahams said that the Selectboard voted at a past meeting to have the Town Manager meet with them to get parameters about negotiations regarding Sunday hours at the library. He asked for a follow-up to this

Steve Bannon suggested that the library create a plan before negotiations with the Union begin.

Ed responded that the library was told not to make any plans until after negotiations.

The Town Manager agreed saying that she was to have a conversation first before details are ironed out at the library.

Sean Stanton suggested that this conversation be put on a future agenda in order to determine parameters. All agree that this item will be put on the July 27th agenda.

Dan Bailly pointed out that there are no crosswalks signs in Housatonic and cars are not stopping. Sean Stanton said that crosswalks should also be looked at on Main Street with signs being put up in the middle of the road for better visibility.

Joe Sokul said that he will look at both of these issues.

4. TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT:

A. EUNICE AGAR – PRESENTATION OF HER PAINTING TITLED "146 BARRINGTON FAIR – 1988".

Town Manager, Jennifer Tabakin introduced Eunice Agar and unveiled her painting "146 BARRINGTON FAIR – 1988".

Ms. Agar introduced her painting.

Sean Stanton, on behalf of the Selectboard, presented Ms. Agar a certificate of recognition and appreciation.

B. UPDATE ON SEWER CAPITAL PROJECTS AND RATE STUDY

Joe Sokul spoke about the Waste Water Treatment Plant project. Phase 1 cost \$3.8 million and new presses were just installed making the project 80% complete. Phase 1 is anticipated to be complete by the end of October 2015.

Phase 2 plans will go to the DEP at the end of October 2015 for review and comments. The project will go out to bid in January with a contract signed by the end of April.

There was an initial work meeting for the sewer rate study, in May. Information has been gathered by the water companies. The consultant is still working on his analysis. There will another meeting in July.

Sergeant Storti spoke about the Taconic Ave traffic study.

Sargent said that the police department is using a three-pronged approach for enforcement in this area.

- 1) There are 3 hours per shift of random patrol in the area.
- 2) There is a compilation of the speed spy radar data.
- 3) A speed trailer is being used to post drivers speed.

Jennifer Tabakin said that equal attention will be paid to speeding on East St.

Joe Sokul said that Taconic Ave. and Alford Rd. are scheduled to be paved by October 30th.

Sargent Storti said that the new blacktop will increase speed. He is aware of this and will keep on top of it. Joe added that there will also be speed signs posted on poles flashing the speed of vehicles.

An audience member said that no one speeds in Egremont and suggested that more tickets are issued. Jennifer Tabakin said that there is a balance between enforcing speed and ticketing. She asked the Selectboard to consider a policy direction on this balance.

Town Manager, Jennifer Tabakin said that appointment to committees should be the focus for the new fiscal year.

Town Manager, Jennifer Tabakin recommended that she hold 2 workshops explaining how we set our taxes. She said that there are revenue consultants that can be present, as well, to provide information. Sean Stanton said that the workshop should be scheduled far enough ahead so that people can informatively decide.

The next community conversation meetings are scheduled for 10/6/15 and 1/6/16 at 6:30 PM at the Senior Center meeting room.
