LEARN HOW TO ATTRACT WILDLIFE TO YOUR BACKYARD

GREENFIELD — Ever wondered why some people have lots of birds in their backyard, and others don't? What are wildlife looking for when they are feeding or looking for a home?

On Saturday, June 9th, a volunteer from the Speaking for Wildlife Program will present "A Garden for Wildlife: Natural landscaping for a better backyard" from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at the Stephenson Memorial Library in Greenfield.

The presentation, part of the *Speaking for Wildlife* Project, will highlight ways that anyone can improve their landscaping and gardening practices to provide habitat for different kinds of wildlife. You'll learn techniques to attract songbirds, mammals, hawks and owls, and even mysterious amphibians such as red-backed salamanders to your backyard.
