He recommended that they have a contingent approval of dedication, allow the building department to issue the two current building permits that had been reviewed and that there would be one additional permit that could be issued until Mr. West signs the approval. If Mr. West signs the approval, then all contingencies would be met and the dedication would occur and the developer could obtain all the permits needed.

He would sign when the issues were taken care of. No Certificate of Occupancy would be issued until all contingencies were met.
