GENERAL MAIL / DISCUSSIONS

Cemetery Superintendent & Burial Agent Reappointment

Moved by Millias and seconded by Garron, the Board unanimously voted to reappoint Robert Badore as Cemetery Superintendent & Burial Agent, with a term to expire on May 13, 2017.

Animal Control Officer Reappointment

Moved by Millias and seconded by Garron, the Board unanimously voted to reappoint Noreen Callahan as the Animal Control Officer, with a term to expire on April 30, 2017.

Road Cut – Johnson Construction / Elm Street

Moved by Millias and seconded by Garron, the Board unanimously approved Permit 2016-30 issued to Johnson Construction to excavate a 3.5 foot wide road cut across Elm Street to install a triple gate valve on the easterly side of Elm Street to bring in an 8" C900 PVC water main onto Amanda's Way.

Cemetery Deed

Moved by Millias and seconded by Garron, the Board unanimously voted to sign a cemetery deed that was presented from the Town Clerk.

<u>Use of Town Green – Congregational Church</u>

Moved by Garron and seconded by Millias, the Board unanimously granted a request from the Congregational Church the use of the Town Green on Saturday, June 4th, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. for a plant sale and for a farm animal display related to an educational outreach for the Heifer Project.

Plymouth County Registry of Deeds

The Plymouth County Registry of Deeds will be holding office hours here at the town Hall in the selectmen's meeting room on May 26th from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon. They will be here to answer questions or concerns about any Registry of deeds matters for the public and town employees.

<u>Earth Removal Permit – Morse Brothers</u>

A hearing has been schedule for June 14th regarding a request for an earth removal permit from Morse Brothers. Garron suggested maybe talk with them about the use of pesticides. Millias asked if they were making another bog and how will they be transporting the removal through the town.

Order – Brockton Water Commission

In February the Central Plymouth County Water District Commission issued an order to the Brockton Water Commission directing them to cease diverting water from Monponsett Pond no later than May 1, 2016 and to fully open the lower sluice gate in the Stump Brook Dam from May 1, 2016 through September 30, 2016. At this time Brockton is not obeying this order.

Meal Tax

Seelig has sent in the Notification of Acceptance/Rescission for the Local Meal Tax to the DOR. This will take effect July 1, 2016.

Town Meeting and Election

Millias wanted to thank everyone for coming to Town Meeting and Garron appreciated everyone staying until 11:30 pm.
