### Raspberry Farm

Mr. Ziolkowski discussed:

- Tick problems can be alleviated by creating paths with bark mulch. The chippings will repel the ticks.
- Using a bush hog brush cut instead of haying the fields and, maintaining and manicuring the fields on a weekly basis will help to eliminate the tick problem.
- > Paths can be created by mowing just a path and maintaining a manicured mowed path.
- > Fogging the ticks is much like the mosquito spraying.
- > Adding a pump to be used for resurfacing the face of the ice.

What is the goal of the Raspberry Farm? What are we going to see there? Will we develop a maintenance fund for the future?

A Round Table Committee could be established to bring all the town commissions and boards together for the purpose of discussion:

A delegate from each town commission and board who have interests in the Raspberry Farm to talk about fund raising for the Raspberry Farm. This will eliminate duplication of effort, and to work together to accomplish needs and ideas.

The Commission expressed appreciation to Mr. Ziolkowski for his knowledge on fields, ticks, and the maintenance of the Raspberry Farm.
