HANOVER/NORWICH JOINT BOARD OF SELECTMEN MEETING

Wednesday, January 16, 2002 4:00 P.M. – MUNICIPAL OFFICE BUILDING – HANOVER, NH

The meeting of the Board of Selectmen was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by the Chairman of the Hanover Selectman, Brian Walsh.

Present were: Hanover Selectmen: Brian Walsh, Chairman; Katherine S. Connolly, Vice Chairman; Marilyn Black; William Baschnagel; Jay Pierson; Julia Griffin, Town Manager; Norwich Selectmen: Neil Fulton, Chairman; Alison May; Linda Cook; Douglas Hoffman; and members of the public.

Both Boards highlighted specific concerns they shared with respect to the Dresden building proposals currently under consideration.

NORWICH:

- Loss in a mix of income strata could occur if a significant tax rate impact forced some, particularly older residents, to leave Norwich.
- Significant tax rate increase could result in an inability to pursue other capital projects that are important to Norwich.

HANOVER:

- 1. Concern about driving a wedge between Hanover and Norwich over the differential tax rate impact.
- 2. Concern about losing a key part of Downtown if the High School and Middle School were both to leave the central core.
- 3. Concern about the tax rate impact combined with the uncertainty of school funding alternatives in New Hampshire.

KEY ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Would Hanover pay a "premium" to retain Hanover High School in Downtown (\$5-\$10 million).
- Need to prioritize capital improvements and costs, and to set a dollar limit on what would be a tolerable bond issue.

- Political/tax climate is very fluid right now, both in terms of Act 60 and Statewide Property Tax, as well as building aid, which further supports a "go slow, go in phases" approach.
- Both Boards need to convey a message to the Dresden Board because we all dip into the same tax base.

CONCERNS TO EXPRESS IN JOINT MEETING:

- Potential for division, Dresden very important and needs to be preserved.
- Plus \$40 million too large.
- The way schools are funded in both states is in flux.
- Middle school piece is more important to pursue at this point.

SET UP MEETING:

Neil Fulton and Brian Walsh agreed to set-up a meeting with Anne Segal, Chairman, Dresden School Board to convey the concerns discussed.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:25 p.m.
