- Master Plan and Bike Pedestrian Options.
  - o ORW is contracted to propose a Hanover wide bicycle and pedestrian plan.
  - Class I,II, and III Treatment options, explanations and potential applications in Hanover were reviewed.
    - Class I. Separate Facilities (bike, ped, vehicle).
      - Multi Use Path. Possibly separate with storm garden. Lyme Road is a possibility.
      - Cycle Tracks. Bollard separation in Boulder Colorado
      - Campus Mews. Cycle path with Girl Brook an option.
    - Class II. Bike Lanes
      - Bikes and Cars on same road with lanes.
      - Location options: Park, Wheelock, South Main to Sachem.
    - Class III Shared Lanes.
      - Sharrows, Bike Boulevard
      - Best for low volume, slow traffic calmed streets.
        - O 3 Lane (2 bike and one car) concept was presented. Cares travel both directions in single lane, slow and spread into bike lanes to pass.
