- Difficult to deal with early buyers coming while set up is going on.
- \$1,396 gross, should net +/- \$900
- added to unspent money from last year should have +/- \$1500
- Susan purchased a tent for Sustainable Hanover
- Kiosk was there, but really not an important need

- Discussion revolved around deriving statistics about how much stuff is recycled.
 Dartmouth also has a reused item sale (items donated by seniors in spring, sold in the
 fall when students are moving in). Upper Valley Sierra Club handles all the money.
 Local businesses are disappointed in the lack of sales that took place locally. Stocked

Green Power Study Group Update led by Yolanda

- Study group has been meeting over the summer to evaluate putting an effort together to become an EPA Green Power Community
- Study period is completed and now ready to initiate action
- Would like endorsement of full SHC
- Liberty Utilities program is not well run and likely to be phased out
- 134M kwh
- Hanover needs 3% = 4M kwh
- Municipal Operations need to qualify as a Green Power Partner = 10% of Municipal purchases
- Can buy REC's, self generation
- Town of Hanover's electricity purchase contract is up on Dec 31
- Julia will be presenting a request to the Selectboard in order to discuss the purchase of REC's as part of the new electricity purchase contract
- Lynn asked what is the goal over the long term in regards to REC's vs Self Generation
- DC is curious about passing a tax credit for green improvements
- Hanover is looking at a PPA
- DC is looking at self generation projects as well
- SHC moved that the Town become a Green Power Partner and Hanover then become a Green Power Community. Unanimous approval
