#### **Dartmouth Activities**

Jenna has learned that parking for the Hood renovation in the Dewey Field lot will *not* interfere with the community yard sale. She is working on getting approvals from the necessary college departments.

The Changing Climate Changing Minds symposium will take place on April 8 and 9<sup>th</sup>. Open to the public.

A tour of the organic farm's Maple Sugarbush will take place on Monday, March 21st from 12:00pm to 1:30pm. All welcome.

#### Upper Valley Sierra Club

# <u>Net metering Legislation – Report from Peter</u>

Bill to raise the cap to 75MW approved by the NH house and now goes on to the Senate. Tariff rates likely to be adjusted but as yet to be determined how they'll be changed

## <u>Recycling</u>

Susan reported that there may not be any further pot collections at Longacres as they are going to require checking the recycle number of all the pots that are collected. She is going to confirm with Lebanon landfill that they will accept all plastic pots, regardless of recycle number. She will also check to see if Casella will accept the pots.

Best Buy accepts electronics but there is a \$25 fee for some items.

Still researching to see what happens to clothing/textiles that are donated to LISTEN.

CFLs are accepted at the Lebanon landfill.

Mascoma Bank may host another paper shredding event in April.

The town has told Casella they will not be renewing as of July 1. Peter is studying alternative recycling options and the economies of those options. He will have an update at the next mtg.

Town Meeting prep has Julia fully focused. Nothing to report.
