Secretary's report

Minutes from January meeting approved. Ritter subcommittee did not meet as planned due to delay (from Park and Rec?).

### Treasurer's report

\$600 to Robinson's Marine for shrink wrapping the harvester. Peter notes that invoices are not getting to him and will research the issue.

#### Update on Drawdown and pump

Pond level is still relatively low but the exact value is unknown due to high snow depth. Pump is still not operational – Rich/Ron/Chris from the DPW want to get trained to operate the pump.

Wendy Gendron needs to be contacted to schedule monitoring for phosphate and plant analysis for 2015.

### Harbor Master's update on rules and rowing

Pam Erdos from BHRC is still waiting to have follow-up meeting with residence for follow-up discussion - is now scheduled for Wed Feb 25.

Bob O'Shea has suggested headsets and electric motor to deal with noise issue: Committee discusses 3 points for rowers:

- 100 foot from shore exclusion zone for swimmers. Exclusion zone would not apply to narrow regions between islands.

- Request that BHRC not contest pond drawdowns.

- Request for Summer organized rowing to not occur in the afternoon due to heavy use. Committee votes to approve these 3 items.

### Warren Ave

Meeting with ZBA pushed back until March 11 due to contractor no-show. ZBA might reject permit due to detrimental pond impact.

### Whitman Ave

A long-term resident is trying to sell their home - but is having trouble due to excessive runoff into a wetland. The Conservation Commission is in favor of a sewer line

extension to resident's home and would like the Pond Committee to write a letter of support. Pond Committee votes to approve
