Water and Sewer Commission Update by Cindy Russo

Early proposal about supporting an extension of the present sewer lines for people who are willing to pay out of pocket for the extension so they can connect to the system. Their systems are failing and they are close to wetlands or the pond and the town wells and it would be in the best interest of the community.

This needs to go to Town Meeting for approval by vote.

The money would still need to be borrowed by the town and the homeowners would pay it back.

Building a new Town Well

The town has two wells but they are in the same location. In the event of a contamination, both wells would be affected. It would be prudent for the town to develop another well in different site. The cost will most likely be in the \$150,000 to \$250,000 range.

Keith suggested that the amount in the line on the Capital Plan be more accurate as it will definitely be more than \$100,000.
