Discussions and Actions

- Bob Thurston opened the meeting at 7:04pm
- Tri Board Meeting
- Indicated budgets will be slightly down
- Ron Ricci
 - Indicated state and local receipts are down, challenge for all us to do the best job with the resources that we have available to us
 - Have to avoid putting us in worse shape for next year, can't assume things are going to get better
- Keith Cheveralls Discussion of School budget
 - A very challenging year to pull a budget together. Have been pursuing the budget with zeal. Pushing on all cost center managers.
 - \bigcirc Budget will go to a final vote on 3/15
 - Helping that we are having some Sr. faculty retirements
 - Administrators have agreed to no pay increases despite contracts calling for them
 - Devens contract dollars are being used to fund the schools
 - \circ \$353K from school choice
 - There is no provision for any contract settlement that may come from ongoing negotiations
 - Tim Bragan State of the State
 - Local aid Governor saying level funding, Sr. Eldridge saying down 10%. We originally budgeted down 15%, have now adjusted down 10%
 - Town did a great job of putting us in a good position for this year
 - State aid will not be increasing anytime soon
 - Finance Committee already looking out at FY12
- Lorraine Leonard State of the Town
 - \odot Reviewed the current recap State aid from 15% to 10%
 - Healthcare instead of 7% going to 10.9%
 - Recap shows a deficit of \$162K
 - \odot No articles from the selectman yet, \$50K set as ide.
- Debbie Ricci Capital Committee
 - Presented a summary of capital requests
 - Reviewed each departments requests
 - Departments should increase their maintenance budgets so there will be fewer capital requests in the future
 - \odot In total \$1,065K in Capital requests for this fiscal year
 - Biggest piece is a new fire truck We bought it in 1981 refurbished in 1998 \$550K

requested

- \circ We only have \$200K in the Capital line item this year.
- Historically we have funded Capital from stabilization fund

• Bob Thurston

- Described what we asked each dept. to submit level (includes healthcare increase) and down 5%
- Most of the budgets are back
- Praised DPW and its creative thinking around a number of items, called out outsource of street sweeping
- Some departments will be cut more than others.
- \odot Indicated that we have the budget deficit under \$100K
- Budget does not include any pay increases.
- \odot We need to get to a level funded budget
- Stabilization fund at 1.6mil. can't really go down or you risk our bond rating
- Discussion around free cash
- \odot Need to get to zero deficit by March 30th
- George commented on healthcare costs increase are out of control
- \circ Tim indicated that we would have budget deficit to \$0.00 in two weeks.
- Stu Sklar commented that fire truck is needed and that we should plan to ask for override next year.
- Discussion on fees and our vote to support school committee on bringing to selectman a request for a warrant to reduce athletic fees.
