PUBLIC HEARING: Town of Harvard, Bromfield School Parking Area

The commission went into a public hearing to discuss the parking area. Since there was no one from the public present, the public hearing was closed.

Moe questioned moving Ministers walk. It will be a gravel walkway along the cemetery wall and will circle around the parking lot near the school entrance. Rich and Robert described the parking lot area, as well as islands for vegetation and lighting. The proposed lot will accommodate the same number of cars as previously but will allow for more uniform parking. The project was unanimously approved.

NEW APPLICATIONS: 5 Fairbank Street, Replacement of Window

John presented his application for a new window at the side of his home. The current picture window faces the Old Library. It will be replaced with a smaller window with two over two panes. These are in keeping with the other windows in the house. Boston Sash and Millwork is the manufacturer. Renderings of the window were available to the commissioners.
